

Offerings

It is not likely that the Rupert UMC will be raided by ICE. If we were, it would probably not be on Sunday morning with our mostly lily-white congregation. It might be on a Food Pantry day, but that is also unlikely. Even so, we still need to know what to do if ICE did enter the church.

It is not legal for us to knowingly abet an undocumented immigrant by concealing, harboring, or shielding the person from detection. If ICE came to RUMC, I would encourage us not to rush people out of the church. An ICE agent would be within their rights to enter our lobby, Sanctuary, and fellowship hall. If an ICE agent asks questions about someone's immigration status, we are within our rights not to answer.



ICE agents may enter the public spaces of a church without a warrant, but not private areas. If an ICE agent wants to enter a private area, they must present a hard copy warrant signed by a federal judge. A deportation order or arrest order is not the same as a judicial warrant and does not permit an agent to enter a private space. We would ask to see the Judicial warrant if an ICE agent wanted to go through the whole church.

What is a private space in a church? It would be the responsibility of the Leadership Board to identify and distinguish private spaces in the church. The Pastor's office, the music office, the food pantry, and the archives room are the places I would consider to be private. They are private because only designated people enter these areas, and they are usually locked.

If, on the off chance, ICE comes to RUMC, don't panic. Be polite and respectful. Send someone to locate and tell the pastor, since I have been trained on the legalities. We will follow the laws regarding immigration in this church, and we will also expect our government workers with ICE to follow the immigration laws. No matter what your opinion is regarding undocumented workers and immigration, it is important for all of us to know our rights. We welcome and love all people, from undocumented workers to ICE agents, from those who want immigrants to be removed to those who want to protect immigrants, from undocumented families to long-time Rupert residents. We love. We strive to do no harm



LABOR DAY FAMILY CAMP / SIGN UP NOW!

Rupert Labor Day Family Camp is a 3-4 day weekend of faith, fun, games, hiking, crafts and much more. Camp officially starts on Saturday morning of Labor Day weekend but camp is open for those that like to come up on Friday. If arriving on Friday you will need to provide your own dinner as camp meals start Saturday morning.



Cabins are available for individuals and families to stay in. Cabins have bunk beds but no electricity. There are bathrooms

in the cabin areas that have electricity, flush toilets and hot showers. There is also a camp area that can accommodate campers and tents. There are electric and water hookups.

The main lodge has electricity, running water and the camp kitchen where all meals are prepared. Everyone is encouraged to sign up to help with at least one meal prep and one kitchen clean up after meals. All food for the weekend is provided by the camp fund. There is a charge per person according to age. This fee pays for the use of the camp. Campers are allowed to bring snacks and drinks for use in cabins and/or lodge. There is a snack table in the kitchen where those who want to share snacks can put their contributions for anyone to have at any time. Coffee, ice tea and hot chocolate is available at all times.

Some of the activities during the weekend are bible study, crafts, pretzel making, homemade ice cream making, games, corn hole tournament, hiking, biking, swimming in the river (it is very cold), relaxing, napping, Sunday Service at outdoor chapel, and just enjoying the great outdoors in a great place.






4th OF JULY
