Does Worry and Anxiety Plague You?

We have all sorts of caring people encourage us to "not worry" but many times that is very difficult to do. I grew up in a family of worriers so it's easy to pick up that attitude from others. The Greek word for worry and worry's companion, anxiety, is "Merimnao": The verb merimnao means "to have concern for something" or "to be troubled, anxious, or fretful". Merimnao is a combination of the words merizo ("to divide") and nous ("the mind"). It is usually translated "to care, to be anxious, to be concerned."

Worry drains us of energy and purpose. Jesus said this about worry in Matt. 6:26 "...I tell you, do not worry...!" Then He presents all the things His disciples were experiencing that caused them to worry. This was a command Jesus gave His disciples and applies to us, too.

Another important scripture is Philippians 4:6-8, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable-if anything is excellent or praiseworthy-think about such things."

A closer look at anxiety and its definition:

- · An uneasy feeling of uncertainty, agitation, dread, worry or fear; the common human reaction to stressful circumstances. Anxiety can manifest itself in ungodly concern about provision, performance, or reputation. It appears to be rooted in incomplete knowledge, lack of control over circumstances, or failure to take an "eternal" perspective on things.
- Occasionally, anxiety can be a symptom of guilt. (Psalm 38:18)

Steps to take to be set free from worry:

- 1. Confess that it is not God's will to worry. When worried thoughts come to mind, respond with "Worry, you have to go from my mind. I am talking to Jesus about this matter and He will help me". Anxiety is a subtle insinuation that God is either unable or disinclined to see to our welfare. We have a watchful caring heavenly Father who is ever mindful of our daily needs.
- 2. Recognize the futility of worry, we cannot add an inch to our stature. (Matt 6:27)
- 3. Cultivate a growing understanding of God's power and fatherly disposition. (Matt 6:26 Luke 12:30)
- 4. Entrust to God the things that we cannot control (1 Peter 5:7) "Casting the whole of your care - all your anxieties, all your worries, all your concern, once and for all - on Him; for He cares for you affectionately, and cares about you watchfully."
- 5. View things in eternal perspective. (Matt 6:32-34)
- 6. Substitute prayer for worry and then think on scriptures about Jesus meeting our every need. (Phil. 4:6-8, see above)

Jesus, knowing that when "worry" tries to come against me, I will call out your Name to focus on you. Amen. Love.



The Heart of Worship: Reverence and Expression through Faith

Worship is an intentional act of reverence, praise, devotion, and intimacy with God. While perspectives on appropriate worship expressions may vary due to cultural norms, theological interpretations, and personal beliefs, scripture consistently emphasizes that true worship is rooted in the posture of the heart, faith, and openness toward God.

We might think it strange to imagine a dignitary or the president of The United States dancing profusely before the Lord in a church service. However, A profound biblical example of uninhibited worship is found in the story of King David. As the Ark of the Covenant symbolizing the tangible presence of God was brought into Jerusalem, King David danced and shouted before the Lord with all his might (2 Samuel 6:14-22)! His display of exuberant devotion was met with mockery and criticism, as some deemed his behavior undignified for a king. However, King David remained unapologetic, declaring that he would become even more undignified than this. Despite his imperfections, David was described by God as a man after [His] own heart, reflecting the freedom found in worship when motivated by genuine reverence rather than the fear of human judgment.

The prophet Jeremiah similarly captured the intensity of encountering God when he described God's Word as fire shut up in [his] bones (Jeremiah 20:9), signifying the overwhelming desire to express and share the divine experience.

In the New Testament, a notable expression of worship was recorded when a woman poured out an alabaster jar of expensive ointment on Jesus, weeping at His feet and wiping them with her hair! Her act of devotion was met with scorn by legalistic and religious onlookers who considered it wasteful and improper. Yet, Jesus commended her (Luke 7:37-50), revealing again that true worship transcends societal expectations. Similarly, in Matthew 21:16, after Jesus healed the blind and the lame in the temple, children were found crying and praising Him, prompting complaints from religious leaders who deemed their expressions inappropriate and sinful.

After the resurrection of Christ, the Apostles were out healing the sick and preaching the gospel; One man, after being healed was found leaping and praising God.

On the day of Pentecost, when the believers were gathered in unity, they experienced an outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-4). The encounter was so extraordinary that bystanders accused them of being drunk. These accounts demonstrate that genuine encounters with God often defy human logic and societal norms and may appear unconventional and be rejected by onlookers.

Despite the criticism and mockery faced by those who worshiped passionately in scripture, each individual decided to worship God freely by faith. From David's dance to the believers at Pentecost and after, their worship was a conscious decision to seek and honor God with open hearts and complete surrender. Their experiences illustrate that authentic worship requires a willingness to abandon the opinion of others and embrace the presence of God fully.

As believers grow in their revelation of God's perfect love, they can become more attuned to the Holy Spirit and less concerned with spectators. Supernatural encounters with God may challenge human reasoning and cultural expectations, but they reveal the profound intimacy and transformation that is available through the decision to worship. When faced with criticism or persecution, we can take comfort in knowing we stand among a great cloud of witnesses, including Jesus Himself.

May we be completely open to the Holy Spirit, unashamed and fully devoted in offering our deepest love expression to Him, for He is certainly worthy.
