


Organ Prelude in F Major Russell Romine, organ J.S. Bach

In Remembrance: The Rev. Dr. William Yeager, pastor and head of staff from 1979-1989, died on Saturday, January 6, 2024, at the age of 92. A memorial service will be held at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis, MN, on Saturday, February 3rd, at 11am. Bill's ashes will be buried with his wife, Jane, in Riverside Cemetery in Fargo, at a later time. Jane died during Bill's tenure at the Fargo Church.



Ordinary Time Banner: Baptism marks the beginning of the Christian life. The Baptism of our Lord marks the beginning of these days between the two great festivals of the Christian year. The shell at the tip of the banner reminds us of our own baptisms and points us to the church, represented by a boat. The seas are choppy and yet the church manages to stay afloat, spreading God's good story wherever it finds itself. The fish in the sea reminds us of Jesus' ministry and His call to others to become fishers of men and women, and of His miracle of the loaves and fishes. The dove near the top of the banner, hidden in the clouds, symbolizes the presence of the Holy Spirit.

The banner is in many hues of green symbolizing the growth of discipleship which comes after baptism, in the community called the church, and extends into all the world.
