It's nearly the end of the first quarter and I'm happy to report that membership and attendance are growing and giving has increased, allowing us to continue our great ministry in our community. We have a lot to be thankful for this year. Yet, if you've been paying attention, you know that we've been operating with a budget deficit for a few years. The time has come to adjust to our reality. We need to make significant changes to our staffing structure in the next 18 months.

Since fall, Session and your pastors have been working diligently to analyze our future needs and prayerfully recommend changes that match our resources. While researching our options, we were presented with and pursued a plan to work with other local Presbyterian churches. A consolidation would allow us to:

- merge administrative tasks and use the savings to retain employees,
- increase mission and pursue new mission opportunities that may be available only if we combine our strength,
- secure our own future and the future of the Presbyterian witness in the Fargo-Moorhead area,
- help more people come to know the love and healing presence of Christ in their lives, and
- expand our impact on the lives of people in this community and throughout the world.

Before we make our final decision, we want your input. We are hosting several informational meetings so we can share our plans in more detail, answer your questions, and get your feedback. As you listen to and process these plans, there may be the temptation to resist change, fear the unknown, or cling to what has been. (Believe me, we all wish we didn't have to change what is clearly wonderful.) Please remain open to what God might be doing in our midst. We are not the first generation of God's faithful to experience an uncertain future and we will not be the last, but we remember that God is from everlasting to everlasting.

Soon, you will receive a letter from the Session with more details about the proposal and a list of Informational Meeting dates. We hope that you will join us for one of the offerings. A recording will be available in early May for those who cannot attend.

I hope you sense how excited I am about the future of First Presbyterian Church. I love this congregation, our staff and our mission. I believe that God has something great planned for us.


