News from Session - Shine On Update

We have received commitments to the Shine On Campaign for a total of \$2.3M. We have received \$230,000 in actual contributions meaning that we have satisfied the matching requirement for the National Grant. The final list of projects has been reviewed and approved by both the Buildings and Grounds Committee and the National Fund team. It has been updated to reflect the results of our Building Conditions Report (May 2025). If you'd like to see the full list, it's available through the church office.

Session has approved working with Shultz + Associates Architects (S+A) as we move into the project phase of our Shine On campaign. Thanks to the generosity of architect David Shultz, who is donating a portion of his time, we'll receive these professional services at a reduced rate.

S+A will take on the responsibilities of both architect and general contractor, coordinating the bidding process and managing specialized contractors. The Buildings and Grounds Committee and our Building Manager, Rick Fiebiger, will provide direction and oversee the day-to-day activities. Our contract with S+A allows us to select the contractors we use.

Some of the work will take place this winter. We expect about 10 to 12 weeks of scaffolding or related construction equipment to be present, but worship will continue as usual. There may be a few weeks when the organ will be sealed off to protect it from construction dust. We'll adjust our music offerings accordingly.

Staffing Changes

As we continue our commitment to balance the church budget by the end of 2025, the Session has decided to eliminate the Music Coordinator position, effective at the end of August. This position was initially created as a temporary role to accommodate Sally Harmon's needs, allowing her to continue her invaluable service to the church and granting us additional time to thoughtfully restructure our staff and resources.

Additionally, the Session has extended the interim organist position through the end of 2025. This extension will provide us the necessary time to thoughtfully explore our options before making any permanent hires.




Join the Song!

NYK Returns to FPC August 10!


