New Year, New Era

As we move into a new year, our congregation enters a season we have never experienced before. Mary's retirement marks the end of a beloved chapter and the beginning of a new one. While many of us will miss her deeply, this next season is something that you and I will walk together.

As we begin this season, it is important to restate the boundaries that accompany Mary's retirement.

In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), when a pastoral relationship concludes, a period of separation is required by our constitution. Mary and I have agreed to one full year of separation from all pastoral functions. This allows her to step fully into retirement and gives the Associate Pastor Readiness Task Force (APRTF) the time they need to discern next steps for pastoral leadership.

Mary will continue to live in the Fargo area, and you may see her around town. You are welcome to greet her warmly and share casual, non-church conversation. She can receive your cards and expressions of gratitude, pray for you and for the congregation, enjoy retirement, visit other churches, and engage socially in the community.

During this year, Mary will not provide pastoral care, officiate or assist at funerals, weddings, baptisms, or other rites, meet to discuss church business, attend Session or committee meetings, advise on leadership matters, or engage on social media as your pastor. All pastoral needs should come directly to me as Head of Staff.

At the conclusion of this year, once the task force has completed its work, Session and Mary may consider a new agreement that reflects the needs of the congregation at that time.

In time, I hope you will feel increasingly comfortable turning to me when you are carrying stress, grief, or simply need a listening ear. This new chapter invites us to deepen our relationship, build trust, and discover together the new ways God is shaping our life as a congregation.

Shine-On Campaign Update

- Current progress: Thanks to the generosity of over 115 families, we've received \$2.4 million in pledges with \$290,000 of cash received to date.
- External campaign launching: In January, we will begin the external phase of the Shine On campaign, which will run for several years. This phase will invite community partners, friends of the church, and local organizations to participate. Donation kiosks in our entryways will help share the Shine On story with everyone who visits our building.
- New preservation fund: Friends of First Presbyterian have opened the 650 2nd Ave. Fund with the FM Area Foundation to support the preservation of our historic building. Unlike church funds, this fund remains with the building regardless of the future of the congregation. It also allows those who care deeply about historic preservation but are unable to give to a religious institution to support ongoing maintenance and care.
- National Fund for Sacred Places: In November, we submitted project-ready documentation to the National Fund for Sacred Places and in late December we received authorization and partial funding to begin working on the building. A huge thanks to David Shultz and Rick Fiebiger for their hard work getting us ready for this moment.

2026 rate = \$50.00 per confirmed member.


