

# **Space for Healing**

At First Presbyterian Church of Fargo and Baker Downer Presbyterian Church, we are creating spaces where people can experience the healing of Christ. That kind of healing does not happen by accident. It grows when we choose to lead with love, when we decide that our faith in God's goodness is bigger than our need for control or comfort.

The apostle Paul wrote to Timothy, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline." Paul's words, written from prison, were full of peace and courage. He reminded Timothy to hold fast to faith and love, and to trust in God's power to bring new life.

That same charge is ours today. As a church, we face seasons of change, new people joining us, new ideas taking shape, and new leaders rising among us. At Fargo, we see it in the energy of our committees, the creativity of our worship, and the steady stream of visitors who are finding a spiritual home. Each new face and idea brings the possibility of renewal if we can approach change with grace instead of fear.

How we respond makes all the difference in the world. We can let our discomfort and skepticism rule the day, muttering under our breath, creating distrust and hard feelings, sending people who want to join us in our efforts packing. Or we can choose another way. We can help. We can come alongside new ideas, welcome new people by learning their names, inviting them to an event, and telling them how excited we are that they are here.

At Baker Downer, this same spirit of welcome is taking shape in tangible ways. With a new business now operating out of our church building, we will be moving some things around and making room, physically and spiritually, for new possibilities. And as another new business begins in the grain elevator next door, we may soon find ourselves greeting new visitors and forming new connections. These are holy opportunities. They are invitations to practice faith that trusts in what God is doing rather than clinging to what we have always known.

A recent sermon reminded us that "love without pressure" is the heart of the gospel. Christ's faithfulness frees us from the need to control outcomes or insist on perfection. We are called instead to love with the gentleness and patience of grandparents, cheering from the sidelines, forgiving easily, and delighting in every sign of growth.

This is what it means to live by the power of God: to show up with joy, to make space for others, and to trust that God is already at work among us. Whether in Fargo or Baker Downer, we are building communities of belonging where God's healing can take root and grow.


