Jesus said, "What is the kingdom of God like? It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden." - Luke 13:18-19

For those of you who worshiped on the lawn with us on Rally Day this fall, you heard me preach on how the Kingdom of Heaven is like the mustard seed, which was considered a weed for the first-century farmer. It was small enough to evade detection, invasive once it took hold, and impossible to control.

The same was true for Jesus and his followers. As small and insignificant as they may have seemed, they carried the power to upend entire political and religious systems. That same power is at work in us, which is why this year's stewardship theme is The Power of God, with a dandelion as our logo. The dandelion pops up where it is not wanted and pushes through cracks in sidewalks. It grows in the sun. It grows in the shade. It scatters its seeds with the slightest breeze.

Like the dandelion, God is preparing us to break through the cracks where neighbors fall through, those without homes, without food, without support. We are being sent to grow where no one expects growth, scattering far and wide generosity, justice, and hope.

First Presbyterian Church has faced many changes over the past few years that have prepared us to disrupt the status quo and care for those who fall through the cracks.

- We reduced staff and consolidated with Baker Downer. In 2026, we will have our first balanced budget since 2015, freeing us to dream and plan.
- No longer weighed down by survival, Baker Downer now pours energy into mission and as a result our combined mission budget has grown from 7 percent to 9 percent in 2026.

Folks, the Gospel is alive at First Presbyterian Church. The Kingdom of God is at work here, relentless, surprising, and unstoppable. Thanks be to God!

"Praying Our Goodbyes" Pilgrimage Class

With her own retirement looming, Pastor Mary will lead a two-part class on "Praying our Goodbyes." Perhaps the most poignant goodbye in our lives is at the time of a loved one's death.

For those of us who struggle with goodbyes, perhaps it gives us strength knowing that God remains with us in the struggle. Some goodbyes bring joy, others bring dread, still others bring sorrow. The premise of this class is that God remains present in our goodbyes.




