#### Jesus Is

Few years back, I took the wife shopping at the mall. I'm not the marathon shopper she is, and after a while I found myself outside Macy's in one of those sitting areas where old men go to wait. There were four of us sitting there waiting on our wives. (I was the youngest, but once they were all young too when they first sat down. Giggles.) I suggested we each throw \$5 on the table and the first wife to come out, that man wins the money. They all laughed, but not one of them was willing to gamble \$5. Thirty minutes later, the oldest man there, his wife came out. He looked at us with a huge smile and said, "Hey, I win!" We all laughed. As he stood up to leave, he said over his shoulder, "Losers!" We all lost it.

Interesting thing: some people also treat Jesus as if they were shopping in a store for only the things they wanted and nothing more. I want Jesus as my Savior, but I'm not looking for a Lord. Why is Jesus "Savior" something we want, but Jesus "Lord" is something we don't want? I think we all know the answer to that. I want Jesus to heal me today, but I'm not interested in someone I need every day. I want a little of this, but I'm not shopping for that. Are you starting to see the problem?

Even further, I don't want to go to hell, but I'm not interested in having a Master. I want to be saved, but I'm not wanting a King. In other words, take me to heaven, but while I'm here on earth, I want to be in charge. Jesus is both, not either/or. If you take the one, you get the other, and it's the lacking of the other that is causing so many problems in our world.

Our October sermon series will dive into this issue a lot deeper and challenge our way of looking at Jesus. Looking closely at who Jesus is and why we need both, is exactly what this world needs right now. It's what we need. It's having all of Jesus, all of who He is, that helps to bring control. Problem? A world that throws off Jesus, even part of who He is, will soon become out of control. Look around. You can see this can't you?

The Bible App (bible.com). This is a phone app and a website. This site contains several Bible reading plan guides to help you feel more comfortable in prayer. And it's FREE!










#### 6th-12th Grade Fall Fest!

#### API, or Asia Pacific International,

is dedicated to nurturing leadership within Indonesian churches and fostering the growth of the Church throughout the country. Their mission involves traveling to encourage and train leaders, as well as organizing a significant national conference that promotes training, encouragement, and fellowship among believers. They are also deeply involved in relief work, women's training initiatives, preschools, and parent training, all of which have a positive impact on local communities. Lincoln Christian Church directly supports two church planting teams through our partnership with API.

API's history traces back to its establishment in 1970 by American missionaries Carl and Grace Fish, and Chuck and Nance Winegarner. Notably, their language teacher, Gideon Tanbunaan, played a pivotal role in the organization's success and leadership development.

Indonesia, as the most populous Muslim country globally, presents unique challenges for church planting. While the law theoretically allows for the freedom to choose the Christian faith, the country maintains a predominantly pro-Muslim stance, making the maintenance and growth of churches a demanding endeavor. Despite the constitutional provision for religious freedom, Christians in Indonesia can face persecution at any time.

We are enthusiastic about supporting API's ministry because of its unwavering commitment to church planting. API consistently trains and sends out church planters to predominantly Muslim communities. While they do receive financial support from other countries, such as the United States, it's important to highlight that the mission is entirely run and staffed by dedicated Indonesians.

API sends out a prayer newsletter via email that details recent developments and prayer requests for the many church planters API supports and trains. If you would like to know more about the ministry or sign up for their prayer newsletter, please reach out to the Global Impact Team at:

So much has changed since 1965 when the Christian Village began its mission of empowering older adults in mind, body, and spirit through a faith-led ministry. Who but the Good Lord above could have envisioned the impact the Christian Village would have across the Midwest. The Christian Village has been and continues to be the heartbeat for all other Christian Horizons communities. From the foundation built in Lincoln so much has been done to ensure Godly care for seniors. The creation of Senior Care Pharmacy, two supportive living programs, Safe Haven hospice, Pathway Home, (housing and care for widows in war torn Myanmar), and last, but not least, a state-of-theart community in St. Louis to meet the needs of many low-income seniors across that city. All of this to live out Psalm 71:9; "Do not cast me away when I am old; do not forsake me when my strength is gone."

A few weeks back, the heart-wrenching decision was made to close the skilled nursing neighbors in

Lincoln. It was with heavy heart and deep sadness and great concern for our residents this decision had to made. While that decision was not easy, it was necessary as the Christian Village prepares for a bright and strong future ahead. Please know the demanding work has begun to add new levels of assisted living care. Please stay tuned as we await the State governing boards approval for our request.

Despite a devastating pandemic, soaring inflation, dramatic expense increases in general operating cost, Christian Horizons is strong. Why? It is because of our church partners who have faithfully provided prayer, financial, and physical support to help our sweet residents thrive! It is with thankfulness for all you have done that we humbly ask you to continue to support this ministry.

With God's blessing and His great help, we have been able to do more than any of us could ever have imagined. Thank you LCC church family; because of you and others like you, the love of Jesus is stronger than ever at Christian Village.
