New Beginners 1: Now What???

Good News:

Romans 6:23 (NLT)

23 For the wages of sin is death, but the <u>free</u> gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord.

So whats next???

Discipleship...

Matthew 28:19

Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The Greek word for make disciples of μαθητεύσατε (mathēteusate) Verb - Aorist Imperative Active - 2nd Person Plural Strong's Greek 3100: From mathetes; intransitively, to become a <u>pupil</u>; transitively, to <u>disciple</u>, i.e. Enrol as scholar.

So the question becomes how to I become a disciple???

Luke 9:23 (NLT)

23 Then he said to the crowd, "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must give up your own way, take up your cross daily, and follow me.

1 Timothy 4:7 (NLT)

7 ... <u>train</u> yourself to be godly.

2 Peter 1:5-8 (NLT)

5 In view of all this, make every <u>effort</u> to respond to God's promises. <u>Supplement</u> your faith with a generous provision of moral excellence, and moral excellence with knowledge, 6 and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with patient endurance, and patient endurance with godliness, 7 and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love for everyone.

8 The more you grow like this, the more productive and useful you will be in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Philippians 2:12-13 (NLT)

12 Dear friends, you always followed my instructions when I was with you. And now that I am away, it is even more important. Work hard to show the results of your salvation, obeying God with deep reverence and fear. 13 For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him.

Colossians 3:23-24 (NLT)

23 <u>Work willingly</u> at whatever you do, as though you were <u>working for the Lord</u> rather than for people. 24 Remember that the Lord will give you an inheritance as your reward, and that the Master you are <u>serving</u> is Christ.

So we Understand that being a disciple takes <u>effort</u> and <u>hard work</u>.... It has been said, "it takes at least <u>3 weeks</u> of daily effort for someone to feel comfortable with a new task.... And it takes about another <u>3 weeks</u> to make it a habit.... Many Christians give up on True discipleship in about <u>3 days</u>...

So who is responsible for your spiritual growth???

Philippians 2:12-13 (NIV)

12 Therefore, my dear friends, as <u>you</u> have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to <u>work out your</u> salvation with fear and trembling, 13 for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.

1 Corinthians 11:1 And <u>you</u> should imitate me, just as I imitate Christ.2 I am so glad that you always keep me in your thoughts, and that <u>you are following</u> the teachings I passed on to you.

2 Timothy 2:15 New Living Translation (NLT)

15 Work hard so <u>you</u> can present yourself to God and receive his approval. Be a good worker, one who does not need to be ashamed and <u>who correctly</u> explains the word of truth.

We are responsible to steward our salvation.... It is not the <u>pastor</u> or the <u>church's</u> responsibility...

Under the law God used specific men and guidelines to communicate to him and from Him....

Exodus 26:31-33 New Living Translation (NLT)

31 "For the inside of the Tabernacle, make a special curtain of finely woven linen. Decorate it with blue, purple, and scarlet thread and with skillfully embroidered cherubim. 32 Hang this curtain on gold hooks attached to four posts of acacia wood. Overlay the posts with gold, and set them in four silver bases. 33 Hang the inner curtain from clasps, and put the Ark of the Covenant in the room behind it. This curtain will separate the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place.

New Beginners 1:

The tabernacle of the Israelites was a highly restricted area. Only Aaron and his descendants were allowed inside the tabernacle to offer sacrifices. (Aaron was a Levite—that is, a descendant of Jacob's son Levi. To be a priest, one must be a Levite. On the other hand, not all Levites were priests. Only a particular family of Levites, the Kohathites, could become priests. Other Levites, however, were involved in the maintenance and transport of the tabernacle.) Penalties for violating access to the tabernacle and its contents were so severe as to result in leprosy or death. Certain rituals inside the tabernacle were so specific that improper administration likewise resulted in death (Leviticus 10:1-7 &16).

Praise the Lord we now have access to God the Father because the Veil has been torn...

Mark 15:37-38 (NLT)

37 Then Jesus uttered another loud cry and breathed his last. 38 And the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

Hebrews 10:19-22 (NLT)

19 And so, dear brothers and sisters, we can boldly enter heaven's Most Holy Place because of the blood of Jesus. 20 By his death, Jesus opened a new and life-giving way through the curtain into the Most Holy Place. 21 And since we have a great High Priest who rules over God's house, 22 let us go right into the presence of God with sincere hearts fully trusting him. For our guilty consciences have been sprinkled with Christ's blood to make us clean, and our bodies have been washed with pure water.

The Lasting thought:

I am <u>responsible</u> for <u>myself</u> for Following Jesus... Discipleship takes hard <u>work</u> but with God's help I can do it...
