ADVENT HYMN DEVOTIONAL

During Advent and Christmastide, we are including a brief devotional over one of the service's hymns. We hope that it helps you sing the hymn's truths with greater honesty and fervency.

Week 1: Hail to the Lord's Anointed

Words by James Montgomery

"He shall come down like showers upon the fruitful earth, and love, joy, hope, like flowers, spring in his path to birth." Stanza 3's opening is breathtaking but also thought provoking. Why does James Montgomery choose the words "fruitful earth?" Why doesn't he write, "He shall come down like showers upon the barren earth," or "rocky earth," or "groaning earth?" Each image is reflected in Scripture, so why does Montgomery choose to call the earth "fruitful?" The answer hinges on the verb tense in stanza 3, "shall come." Earlier, in stanzas 1 and 2, Montgomery writes, "he comes." But in stanzas 3 and 4, he changes to "shall come." Thus, in stanzas 1-2, Montgomery is saying, like Isaac Watts in *Joy to the World*—that Christ has and "is" come, but in stanzas 3-4 that he also will come to complete his saving work.

It might have made sense for Montgomery to use "barren earth" in stanza 3 if referring to those dead in their trespasses and sins, those stony hearts God would change to flesh. But he doesn't focus on this in stanza 3. Instead, he refers to the future and what Christ will do when he comes again. And that's where the "fruitful earth" imagery makes sense. Christ will come again in the fullness of time, when all the seeds sown are ready for harvest. He will claim his own, those born of the earth (for we are fruit of the land) into whom he breathed the breath of eternal life.

Close your eyes and imagine a vista—not a barren one, but a lush vista full of glorious vegetation in every color and variety. Now imagine a life-giving soaking of rain on that land. The hymn writer likens this heaven-given vitality to the love, joy, and hope that springs up in those with whom God is pleased. Another hymn, Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee, speaks of the joys that "none but his loved ones know," and Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken speaks similarly, saying "Solid joys and lasting treasure none but Zion's children know." These are the sentiments Montgomery imparts in this hymn: While God showers physical rain on both the just and the unjust, he pours a special, spiritual fountain over his fruit, his chosen ones—a fountain that brings forth love, joy, and hope in the garden of souls that he tends. — Ryan Kelly
