## CHRISTMAS HYMN DEVOTIONAL

## Angels from the Realms of Glory

Words by James Montgomery

Some hymns look simple at first glance, but on deeper reflection provoke some probing questions. *Angels, from the Realms of Glory* is one of those. At first, it looks like a rather typical Christmas carol, one in which the singer recounts the history of the nativity as described in the Gospels. Luke's account of the angels and shepherds is included, as is Matthew's account of the Magi.

But examine the text more closely. You are not singing about shepherds and wise men. You are singing to shepherds and wise men. That makes things far curiouser; in the context of a hymnal designed for worship, why would we be singing to people long dead?

While James Montgomery is using the Christmas narrative as a framework for his hymn, we are not actually singing to dead people; rather, we are singing to those who mirror the shepherds and sages. In the case of the reference to shepherds, we sing to those whose lives are dominated by their vocation, to those who toil amid spiritual darkness. To them, we proclaim that there is a light that changes everything. To them, we echo the voice of Jesus who told his disciples to leave their boats to follow him (Mt. 4:18-22). To them, we say, "Come and worship."

What are we to make then of the line, "Sages, leave your contemplations?" Here we see an all-too-familiar representation of those who claim to be spiritual people and spend their life ever "searching" and on a "faith journey." They recall the Apostle Paul's warnings about those who are seemingly "always learning" but who never come to a knowledge of the truth (2 Tim. 3:7). Montgomery does not belittle their intellect, and with his poetic, pastoral voice, we call to these philosophers, these morally conscious and sensitive people. To them, we say, "Stop." To them, we say, "You have a moral conscience, but your true desire can only be met by a holy God." To them, we say, "Come and worship Christ." — Ryan Kelly
