DECLARATION OF FAITH* Second Helvetic Confession, *on good works*

Leader: What are good works?
Congregation: Good works grow out of a living faith by the Holy Spirit and are done by the faithful according to the will or rule of God’s Word.

Leader: What is the end of good works?
Congregation: These same works ought not to be done in order that we may earn eternal life by them, for, as the apostle says, eternal life is the gift of God. Nor are they to be done for ostentation which the Lord rejects in Matthew chapter 6, nor for gain which he also rejects in Matthew chapter 23, but for the glory of God, to adorn our calling, to show gratitude to God, and for the profit of the neighbor.

Leader: Are good works important?
Congregation: Although a man is justified by grace through faith in Christ and not through any good works, we know that man was not created or regenerated through faith in order to be idle, but rather that without ceasing he should do those things which are good and useful. For in the Gospel the Lord says that a good tree brings forth good fruit, and that he who abides in me bears much fruit. The apostle says: “For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.”
