



Human Relations Day is this Sunday!

Join us as we celebrate beloved community. Human Relations Day is a denomination wide Special Sunday set aside to celebrate and raise awareness to further the development of better human relations by involving congregations in community and youth outreach. A special offering taken the Sunday before Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday. Gifts received for the offering build King's vision of "the beloved community"

through programs such as Community Developers and United Methodist Voluntary Services and Youth Offender Rehabilitation Programs.

1 Samuel 3:10 calls us to listen to God's voice and plan for our lives. Often, we think we cannot make an impact on our own, but when we accept God's call, we can do incredible things together. Your gifts to Human Relations Day support ministries such as:

Young Worker's Project: This project based at the United Methodist Church of East Congo provides vocational training and support for unemployed young people in the city of Kindu, where high unemployment rates among youth have led to conflict and anti-social behaviors.

Communities of Transformation: A partnership between the Montgomery, Alabama District criminal justice system and the Alabama-West Florida Conference of the UMC will provide the Next Steps Program, which is designed to help those awaiting adjudication. This program lowers the risk of reoffence and offers rehabilitative space.

Heather is offering a one-time class on her research into Palestinian Liberation Theology. It will be Jan. 21 after worship, 11:15 am-12:30 pm, in room 11-12. It will give us some background to receive Rev. Michael Yoshii as guest preacher Jan. 28. Michael spearheads our Conference relationship with Wadi Foquin, a Palestinian village on the West Bank.



Handbell Course for Beginners

Have you ever wanted to try playing handbells? Our handbell director will be

holding a beginning handbell course after church January 14-February 18, from 11:30-12:30 each week. It will be structured based on the musical backgrounds and availability of the participants.

Music reading is not required but may be taught. Participants should be able to stand *for an hour, follow directions, and treat the equipment with respect.* (Accommodations may be made as equipment allows. Common accommodations include a stool to sit on, large-print music or handouts, smaller bells, etc.)

Participants will be expected to attend as many sessions as possible, and to notify me in advance of conflicts. An opportunity to play in church on February 25 will be encouraged for interested ringers but is not a requirement of the class.

Point in Time Count

January 25, 2024, from 5 am - 10 am

Asbury has been asked to help with the Point in Time (PIT) count again this year. On the PIT, we go out into Alameda County and count the number of homeless in a 5-hour time period. This count helps the county to understand how it is doing on ending homelessness and is also used for getting federal and state grants.

PIT is January 25, 2024, from 5 am – 10 am. There will be training, and we will go out in pairs often with a guide from someone who works with unsheltered folks. We had a good contingent from Asbury help in 2023 we hope to have a good turn out this year.

- attending the City Council meetings in person (second and fourth Mondays of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Civic Center Meeting Hall, City Council Chambers located at 1016 S. Livermore Avenue), where you can speak during the public comment section. When you arrive, complete a speaker card to get your name on the speaker list.

TIPS FOR LETTER WRITING:

- Keep it short and genuine
- Let people know what you feel and why
- Please write as a member of the community and a part of Asbury
- Stress the need for housing the unsheltered
- Mention we are making the land available at no cost

- Discuss that it is part of Asbury's mission to care for those who are less fortunate
- Please remain positive in your comments
- This is a healing ministry because we will have wrap around services
- Please note you don't need to include all of the above in your letter—we are just giving you some ideas
