As many of you know, I am scheduled for knee replacement surgery on December 26 (having been postponed from an earlier date). I am told by the surgeon to plan to be gone from work for about 6 weeks. I anticipate being able to join you on worship via livestream! So, some notes about how to talk with a pastor while I'm recuperating:

• From December 26-January 5, please call Rev. Heather Hammer 925-321-4298. Heather will also handle messages from the church office December 26-January 1 as the office is closed.

• From January 6 on, please call our Assistant Minister, Jordan Sylar, 423-790-6183. Jordan will call on others as needed.

Heather and Jordan will preach and lead worship Sunday mornings. In addition, we have three excellent guest preachers and I know you will want to hear and support them:

- January 21, Kim Montenegro is our guest preacher.
 - Bio: Reverend Kimberly Montenegro is the Director of Religious and Spiritual Life at University of the Pacific, in Stockton California. She is an ordained elder and served previously churches throughout the Central Valley of California both as Lead Pastor and a youth director.
- January 28, Michael Yoshii is our guest preacher.
 - O Bio: Rev. Michael Yoshii is a retired clergy in the Cal-Nevada Annual Conference. Prior to retirement in 2020 he served as Co-Chair of the Order of Elders with Rev. Kathy La Point Collup and was also the Co-Chair for the Conference Advocacy & Justice Committee. He served on the General Board of Global Ministries from 2008-2012 and the National Community Development Program Advisory Board of GBGM for over a decade. In retirement, Rev Yoshii has resumed his role as the Co-Chair of the Friends of Wadi Foquin, a partnership with the West Bank Palestinian village of Wadi Foquin started in 2009. In October 2023, Rev. Yoshii received a California Legislature "Life Time Achievement Award" Assemblywoman Mia Bonta in the 18th District. He and his wife, Suzanne, have two daughters and four grandchildren who make sure they stay actively awake (most of the day) to enjoy life and family.
- February 4, Randall Miller is our guest preacher.
 - A longtime advocate for LGBT equality, Dr. Randall Miller is a former Assistant Professor of United Methodist Studies & Ethics at Pacific School of Religion and currently serves as the Chief of Staff at Borealis Philanthropy, a national grant making organization supporting grassroots organizations focused on achieving social justice and racial equity. As a board member of the UM General Board of Church & Society, Randall served on the writing team that produced the revised UM Social Principles.

Asbury has been asked to help with the Point in Time (PIT) count again this year. On the PIT, we go out into Alameda County and count the number of homeless in a 5-hour time period. This count helps the county to understand how it is doing on ending homelessness and is also used for getting federal and state grants.

PIT is January 25, 2024, from 5 am – 10 am. There will be training, and we will go out in pairs often with a guide from someone who works with unsheltered folks. We had a good contingent from Asbury help in 2023 we hope to have a good turn out this year.
