Bless the Lent We Actually Have

Our Lenten worship theme is "Bless the Lent We Actually Have" based on the writings of Kate Bowler. There is also a **40-day Lenten Devotional** which you can download here for your personal use (if you need help with the download, please see Jordan or Pastor Kathy). We encourage you to consider using this devotional as a part of your Lenten practice. Our themes for each week of Lent are printed below and we invite you to read the scripture reading in advance of each Sunday:

Sunday February 18, 2024: First Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed are the Imperfect

Theme: Our culture tries to convince us that perfection is possible if we just try a *little* harder. At its core, the vain labor of perfectionism is an attempt to manage our pain, shame, and fear. The temptation of perfectionism is simi- lar to the temptation that Jesus encountered in the desert. God did not leave his beloved child to figure it out on his own—God sent angels to comfort and care for Jesus. And did you notice the most important part of this test was that once Jesus overcame the temptation, Jesus accepted God's love and help. Maybe we can

learn to do this too in this way we allow God to bless us through our imperfection.

Scripture: Matthew 4:1-11

Sunday February 25, 2024: Second Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed Are The Curious

Theme: As children, we are naturally curious and poke or bite everything we can get our hands on in order to learn more about the things we do not understand. But something about adulthood—its certainty, knowledge, experience, or maybe even access to Google at our fingertips—seems to stifle our curiosity. What is lost when we lose the ability to wonder? To ask questions without easy answers?

Scripture: John 3:1-17

Sunday, March 3, 2024: Third Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed are those who Suffer

Theme: The grand paradox is that a life of faith is not free of pain and suffering. But present too are joy, peace, and love. Our problems do not mean we are outside of God's love... just that we are human, again today. Even if you do all the right things, and work really hard, suffering is a pain- ful part of everyone's story. Even Jesus suffered brokenness, grief, hunger, anxiousness, and pain—and still suffers alongside us.

Scripture: Philippians 4:4-14

Sunday, March 10, 2024: Fourth Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed are Those who Feel Alone

Theme: Loneliness is epidemic in our society. Asbury's core value of celebrating community helps us address this epidemic and churches are uniquely equipped to respond to loneliness, one just has to say yes.

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 4:7-12

Sunday, March 17, 2024: Fifth Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed are Those Who Mourn

Theme: As Jesus teaches us in Matthew 5:4, "blessed are those who mourn." Yet who would choose that kind of blessing? There are so many ways that we might mourn. Dreams that may never become a reality. Children we will never have. Perhaps a childhood that was so traumatic that we never got to be a kid... The story of Lazarus in John chapter 11 is a story for those who mourn, those who are left behind to pick up the pieces of unexpected grief.

Scripture: John 11:1-45 (possibly shortened)

Sunday, March 24, 2024: Sixth Sunday in Lent

Title: Blessed are the Rejected

Theme: Jesus understood this sting of rejection too. On Palm Sunday, he enters Jerusalem like a king. "Hosanna!" the crowd cries. Yet these shouts of praise will soon turn into jeers of unbelief. The same people will cry out just days later,

"Crucify him!"

Scripture: Matthew 21:1-11
