Mission Trip to Repair Mobile Homes

Fifty-year-old mobile homes are not a thing of beauty. They were never intended to last this long. They leak. Floors sag. Mold accumulates from water damage.

Plumbing fails. Electrical becomes a safety hazard. Such were the challenges faced by a recent Cal-Nev mission team.

During the last week of July, the first of two Cal-Nev Conference mission teams undertook the daunting task of repairing two dilapidated mobile homes near Placerville, California. The next team will tackle two more mobile homes in early August.

These homes faced the risk of being "red-tagged" as unlivable. Our goal was to make as many repairs as feasible to help the residents live in their homes in a safer and more sanitary way. We also added updates to make the home more comfortable.

One of the families was a mother, her young adult daughter with two small children. The other was a single mom with three teens. Both had limited income and are living on modest means.

In both homes, we addressed plumbing issues and electrical problems, repaired or replaced walls, replaced kitchen counters and cabinets, repaired or replaced bathrooms, painted and added or repaired flooring. The outcome was an updated and improved living environment.

This mission effort was a partnership with two El Dorado County non-profits – Housing El Dorado and the Non-Profit Construction Corporation. Both are local organizations devoted to providing affordable housing options for seniors, disabled and underserved populations. Our team was from four different churches and was hosted by the El Dorado County Federated Church.

This was a remarkably rewarding effort to put our faith into action for families that find it difficult to maintain their mobile home. We reflected, in our evening devotional time, that it is our purpose, as Christians, to invest in the lives of others. We are to serve as the "hands and feet of Christ" in a world that so needs compassion.
