Thanks to your generous financial gifts, we have raised the necessary funds to cover a full tuning of the organ as well as some additional repairs. I am truly grateful for your generosity, as it will help keep our pipe organ in good working condition for years to come!

Jean and I are working to schedule the project with the technicians. Right now, we hope work can begin in late February and be completed well before Easter. Organ pipes are sensitive to changes in temperature and humidity, so the timing of the project is contingent on favorable weather conditions. We will keep the congregation updated as plans solidify.

Saturday and Sunday, January 6th and 7th, 2024, 1-5pm

When disasters happen, your Cal-Nev Conference deploys Early Response Teams (ERTs) to assist with cleanup and immediate repairs.

ERTs also staff Local Assistance Centers where we offer gift cards for pressing needs, cleaning supplies, hygiene kits and other aid. Most importantly, we offer survivors a place to talk, to process what happened to them.

In 2023, we have deployed ERTs five times related to the Humboldt Earthquake and the winter storm flooding.

If you would like to become an ERT, the next online, virtual training session will be Saturday and Sunday, January 6th and 7th, 2024, 1-5pm both days. You will become an UMCOR trained and badged responder. Click here for more information and to register.

Point in Time Count

January 25, 2024, from 5 am - 10 am

Asbury has been asked to help with the Point in Time (PIT) count again this year. On the PIT, we go out into Alameda County and count the number of homeless in a 5-hour time period. This count helps the county to understand how it is doing on ending homelessness and is also used for getting federal and state grants.

PIT is January 25, 2024, from 5 am – 10 am. There will be training, and we will go out in pairs often with a guide from someone who works with unsheltered folks. We had a good contingent from Asbury help in 2023 we hope to have a good turn out this year.
