... *after* your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.





RAISING TECH-SAVY CHILDREN: CHRISTIAN PARENTING IN THE AGE OF AI

NAVIGATING AI

Today's parents face challenges that previous generations would never have imagined. Artificial Intelligence (AI) is everywhere: in our children's classrooms, their games, their devices, and even their friendships. According to the Christian polling firm, Barna, nearly three-quarters of parents worry about AI's impact on children. And for good reason. AI shapes what our children see, hear, believe, and even how they feel about themselves.

As followers of Jesus, we shouldn't be anxious. Scripture reminds us, "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline" [2 Timothy 1:7](#). Our role as Christian parents isn't to flee from technology but to engage it in ways that assist our children in dealing with a rapidly changing world. The goal should be to raise truth-loving disciples who use technology wisely and for God's glory.

SEEING AI THROUGH A BIBLICAL LENS

AI isn't inherently evil or good; it's a tool. Like every human invention, it reflects both the creativity God has given us and our fallen nature. AI can translate Scripture into new languages, help the blind "see" through image recognition, and support learning in incredible ways. But it can also deceive, distort, and distract. That's why discernment is essential.

Moses prays, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" [Psalm 90:12](#). Wisdom, not ignorance, is what our families need most in the digital age. We must teach our children to recognize that while AI can predict words, only God's Word is Truth. While it can analyze data, it can't understand the image of God in a human soul.

REAL DANGERS IN A DIGITAL WORLD

Many AI tools are designed to keep users, including children, hooked. The longer they stay online, the more data companies collect and the more profit they make. Some apps even act like friends, remembering personal details and responding with programmed emotions. But as Scripture reminds us, "A friend loves at all times" [Proverbs 17:17](#), and AI can't love. It can only imitate care to keep a child engaged.

Other risks are less visible but equally real:

- **Misinformation:** AI doesn't always tell the truth. It sometimes makes suppositions. Children may believe false or biased content because "the computer said it."
- **Data privacy:** Every chat, photo, or voice clip can be stored and sold. Even so-called safe apps may collect data in ways we'd disapprove of.
- **Deepfakes and deception:** AI can now generate realistic images or videos of things that never happened. This calls for supervision, conversations about truth and trust, and the development of skills to identify deceit.
- **Addiction and mental health:** The endless scroll can leave children anxious, lonely, and detached from genuine relationships.

Technology isn't neutral; it promotes ideas and principles. AI will shape children's beliefs, habits, and desires unless we intentionally root them in God's truth.

BUILDING A FAITH FRAMEWORK FOR DIGITAL DISCIPLE-MAKING

So how can Christian parents respond? With prayerful intentionality and practical wisdom. Think of it as a “tiered approach” to technology, adjusting your guidelines and counsel as your children grow:

- **Ages 0-5:** Keep screens minimal. Focus on play, imagination, and Bible stories. When using technology, stay beside your child.
- **Ages 6-10:** Begin simple digital literacy. Explain that people create AI and can make mistakes. Help them learn how to use God given wisdom (they need to know God’s Word) when they connect with AI.
- **Ages 11-13:** Talk openly about online influences, privacy, and AI’s moral implications. Encourage them to “test them all; hold on to what is good,” **1 Thessalonians 5:21**.
- **Ages 14-18:** Shift from control to mentorship. Guide teens in ways that help their faith inform their digital choices and future vocations.

Each stage is an opportunity for disciple-making; to teach discernment, responsibility, and faithfulness in a tech-shaped world.

PRACTICAL AI SAFETY TIPS FOR EVERY FAMILY

- **Keep conversations going.** Ask who your child talks to online and what those chats are like. Engage in active dialogue and ongoing discussions.
- **Teach fact-checking.** Encourage children to ask, “Who created this? Why?” and to verify AI-generated answers with trusted sources or adults.
- **Protect privacy.** Use strong passwords, review privacy settings, and choose child-safe apps.
- **Stay alert to content bias.** Discuss fake news or false messages children encounter and connect them to biblical truth.
- **Set boundaries.** Create tech-free zones, plan family media times, and encourage play, reading, and outdoor activities.
- **Use AI together.** Explore Christian or educational tools as a family so you can guide their understanding firsthand.

These habits don’t just guard against danger; they create guardrails. They teach our children that technology exists to serve, not master us.

HOPE FOR CHRISTIAN PARENTS

AI will keep changing, but God’s truth never will. We can’t predict every challenge, but we can prepare our children to face the future rooted in Christ. As the Evangelical Statement of Principles on Artificial Intelligence reminds us, “Nothing will ever supplant the image of God in which human beings are created.” That means no algorithm can define our worth. No chatbot can replace human love. And no artificial mind can outsmart God.

Let’s lead our families with courage, curiosity, and conviction. Let’s raise children who aren’t only tech-savvy but Spirit-led, who use every tool at their disposal to know Christ more deeply and make Him known more clearly in a digital world.



God is blessing in amazing ways

Across the nation, **countless people are coming to Christ** - hundreds of thousands reached through amazing outreaches in every region of the country.

These are remarkable days. It feels like Acts 4:33 “**And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.**”

Large numbers coming to the Lord is exciting, but every salvation story is unique and special.

One of those remarkable stories is **Fozia's**.

From Sickness to Salvation

Fozia lives in the Bale region of Ethiopia, a strong Muslim area. At the age of 14 she was forced into an unhappy marriage. She now has two children, a boy and a girl.

For years she suffered from a serious sickness. Because of this illness, her husband rejected her, leaving her in serious difficulty. A Christian neighbour told her about Christ and invited her to a Bible study. She was resistant at first, but finally agreed to go, thinking she might receive money from the Church.

She described her first visit: “The teacher did not give me money as I expected, but she only taught me the Bible”. When they prayed in the Bible study demons manifested. They prayed for her and she was delivered. From that day forward she was **healed** from her sickness. She joined the discipleship class and is beginning to grow.

Though she has very little, she has her two children and she is rejoicing in the healing, peace and new life in Christ. She is growing strong in her faith and has become a **bold witness for the Gospel**. Today she hosts a Bible study in her small home and is leading others to Christ.

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times." This first sentence of that masterpiece of English literature, *A Tale of Two Cities* (written by Charles Dickens, author of the classic *A Christmas Carol*) sums up well the type of year it's been in the Eurasia region. Just as the miraculous birth of Jesus that first Christmas was also accompanied by great sorrow (the killing of the babies by Herod in Matt.2:16) 2025 saw some great things happen, but not without real challenges:



First Christmas: Birth of Jesus in Bethlehem



Herod kills babies in Bethlehem

Challenges

1. We still have three Eurasia Global Workers (GW's) battling incurable cancer
2. We had to say goodbye to two more GW units in 2025 (one couple returned to Canada at age 75, the other left to minister at a church in Canada) with no new ones deploying yet.
3. The war in Ukraine continues... with new death & destruction daily... after almost four years.
4. Although a tenuous ceasefire exists in theory between Israel & Hamas in Gaza... and the intensity of the fighting is greatly reduced, praise God...in reality the war drags on... people are still being killed on both sides every day.

Highlights

At the same time God has really been moving in Eurasia. ***Because of your prayers & support***, as we look back over the last decade we see a great trend in the region:

1. The number of countries we are engaged in... nations with PAOC global workers (GW's) or active national partners (NP's)... has grown from 17 to 27

2. The number of national partners (NP's) grew from ten to 22... and the partners themselves are growing:

- **Israel: the King of Kings ministry family has expanded from 12 to 21 congregations**
- **East Ukraine: the Pentecostal Assemblies of Ukraine (PAOU) has expanded from about 50 to 88 churches since the war began**
- **Moldova: the Pentecostal Union (PU) has exploded... from 65 to 402 churches!**
- **Siberia: the Word of the Cross (SOK) network has grown from 25 to 47 churches**
- **West Ukraine: The Lviv Theological Seminary (LTS) church planting satellite school in Kovel has sent out 185 young church planters... 135 of whom are still on the field! (50 left due to the war) Working in teams they have planted churches in 32 villages that had no evangelical church!**

- Slovakia: the Apostolic Church of Slovakia (ACS) has opened ten registered Roma churches and another twelve preaching points that will likely develop into churches. Many are packed & we are helping them buy prefab buildings**
- 3. The Eurasia Regional Fund (ERF) grew from disbursing \$165,000 for ministry in the region in 2016 to giving away a record \$1.5 million this year!**

Because of your prayers & support, this year the ERF was able to use these funds to:

- 1. Invest \$300,000 to partly support the salaries of 37 national workers (in Kyrgyzstan, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Spain & Ukraine)**
- 2. Invest over \$115,000 in training national leaders & church planters (by supporting schools & training programs)**
- 3. Invest almost \$700,000 to help national partners purchase/renovate/build properties & buildings (in Croatia, Kosovo, Poland, Serbia: among the least-reached countries in Europe!)**
- 4. Provide \$75,000 to help buy/repair vehicles for our GW's & NP's**

Church Membership ...

What About Church Membership?

"I don't have to go to church to be saved. I don't have to belong to a church to be a Christian. I can worship God in my heart." Have you heard this popular dodge? It's sometimes difficult to refute because it happens to be true ... to a point. Nothing you do and nothing you can join makes you a Christian. The Bible makes it abundantly clear that Jesus is the only Way; that no-one comes to the Father except through Him.

Q: What does the Bible say about church membership?

A: The Bible is very clear that involvement in, and commitment to, a local church are essential for Christians. Throughout the New Testament the pattern of the Christian is to meet in local congregations (eg. Acts 2:46, 1 Corinthians 14:26, Ephesians 4:16, 1 Timothy 3:15). At some points we are commanded to do so (eg. Hebrews 10:25). Even Saul/Paul in Acts 9:26 – "When he came to Jerusalem he tried **to join** the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he really was a disciple." Having said that, it is true that the Bible nowhere **requires** membership in a church. In fact, in Biblical times there was no such thing. However, the Biblical principle is that the church is a family and a unit. The Bible speaks of the church as a family, or the household of God. Church membership is not like joining a country club; it is about joining an organic family. Church membership is a way of being accountable and becoming involved in the church and in demonstrating a commitment to Christ by participation in the church.

Q: I'm committed to our church, so what difference does it make if I am a member or not?

A: "Times have changed from years ago when you could have a loose relationship with the church. Our society and our laws have changed." There are a number of key differences between people who just attend with no strings attached and the actual church member. There seems to be a deeper sense of belonging and often a higher level of commitment from the people who step out and want to be members. They are more ready to shoulder responsibility and encourage the ethos of the church. Members have the right to vote at church business meetings. This is possibly not the most exciting thing you've ever been able to do, but it does allow you to have a say in what the church does and how it functions. Only church members can vote for deacons (lead team members) and Lead Pastor when a new lead pastor is to be called. Only church members can raise queries and make proposals about issues at a church business meeting. They are able to vote and add input to the sale or purchase of land or buildings for the church. If you would like to have a voice in the way that our church is run and the things that it does you need to have a vote, and to have a vote, you need to be a church member. A knowledge of which people are willing to publicly associate themselves with the church by becoming members assists the church leadership in planning and effectively running the church. If you are a member of another Pentecostal Church and you have moved here to Lacombe, you can have your membership transferred.

Q: How can I become a member?

A: See the Application for Fellowship on the next page or at the Welcome Desk. When you find yourself in agreement with those statements, sign and apply for membership and leave it in the office or with a staff member.

APPLICATION FOR FELLOWSHIP STATUS

Article 6 Membership

Section 1

Persons desiring to become members of this church shall give credible profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. They shall give evidence of compliance with the Biblical standard of Christian practice and manifest spiritual growth by giving evidence of the Fruit of the Spirit: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22,23 NIV)

They shall refrain from acts of sinful nature: "... sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies and the like..." (Galatians 5:19-21 NIV) Sexual immorality shall be interpreted to mean common-law marital relationships, pre-marital and extra-marital sexual relationships (1 Corinthians 6:15-18, 7:1-2, 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8, Hebrews 13:4), and all forms of homosexual activity, along with other practices deemed inexcusable for Christian conduct, and which place a person under God's judgment (Romans 1:26-2:11).

They shall indicate a desire to live in harmony with this body of believers, shall accept the doctrinal standards as set forth in the *Statement of Fundamental and Essential Truths*, and shall be regular financial supporters of this local church.

Section 2

Membership shall consist of the following:

1. *Regular Members.* Persons 18 years of age and over who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 shall be known as regular members.
2. *Junior Members.* Persons between the ages of 12 and 18 who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 may be eligible for junior membership. Such membership does not qualify for voting privileges at congregational business meetings.

Lacombe Pentecostal Church

What Is It?

1. Baptism is a powerful, symbolic expression of the repentance that has happened, your acceptance of Christ as Lord and Saviour, and your commitment to being a dedicated disciple of Christ.
2. It is a public demonstration of a person's union with Christ and His death and resurrection. It comes from the Greek Word "baptizo," which means to *plunge, submerge or immerse*. It signifies that a person's former way of life has been put to death (*under the water*) and points to their new life, saved and redeemed by Jesus through His resurrection (*coming out of the water*).
3. Baptism does not save you. Salvation can only occur through the grace of Jesus Christ and His sacrifice on the cross.

Why Be Baptized?

Baptism is a step of obedience, faith and commitment.

1. STEP OF OBEDIENCE: Jesus commands baptism for everyone who follows Him. Even Jesus, who had no sin, identified Himself with those who were repenting and was baptized.
 - Read Matthew 28:19, Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38, Matthew 3:16
2. STEP OF FAITH: You don't need to have everything figured out to be baptized. The act of baptism is a step of faith in what Jesus has done and is continuing to do in your life.
 - Read Acts 8:35-38
3. COMMITMENT: Baptism is an external act that signifies you are ready to embrace spiritual growth and transformation
 - Read 1 Peter 3:21

What's Next?

1. What should I do to prepare myself for baptism?

- Spend time in prayer and reading scripture. Reflect on Jesus' love for you.
- Invite your friends and family! This is a significant moment in your life. Celebrate it!
- Ask someone you care about to come to the front and pray for you during the baptism (*No testimonies or long stories please. Just a 1-2 minute prayer and Bible verse*)
- OPTIONAL: Practice sharing your testimony (*the story of how came to faith*)

2. What should I wear and what do I need to bring with me?

- Bring shorts or pants that can get wet. Shirts are provided and you can keep them!
- Have dry clothes to change into after the baptism
- Consider asking a friend or family member to take pictures or a video.


3. Can my family or friends be baptized together?

- Yes! If each family member or friend understands fully what it means to be baptized, we encourage it! Every person who wants to be baptized should.
- Remember this is a personal statement of faith, not a family tradition.

4. How will this look in a service?

- After the sermon, when the music starts playing, dismiss yourself and head upstairs to the baptism door. Come down the stairs carefully as soon as the person ahead of you comes up.
- Please ask someone ahead of time to come to the front microphone to pray for you and share a blessing/verse (*Please ask them to keep this to 1-2 minutes*)
- Those baptizing you may ask a few questions and then they will say "*I now baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.*"
- You will be tipped backwards just enough to cover your face and then brought back up immediately. At no time will you be let go. Feel free to hold your nose with one hand if that will help you feel more comfortable.
- You will go up the stairs and can dry off, change your clothing, and celebrate this great moment in your life as a disciple with your friends, family, and the church.
