

As one of the 2-3 workers in the Nursery, you will care for the children by holding them, playing with them, reading to them, and praying for them.


Adult Sign-In Worker (9:45-10:15am)

When they went to donate the funds, the sanctuary staff gave them a special tour and even let the students release three sea turtles back into the sea—an unforgettable moment! And to top off that same week, Abby was named *Student of the Year* for her section of the primary school. She's worked hard all year, and we couldn't be prouder!

Looking Ahead: Visitors, Vision and Prayer

Over the next few weeks, we're thrilled to welcome some friends from Edmonton who will be visiting us here. While we're away spending time with them, please pray for our team as they continue to lead Monday Night Church and other activities in our absence.

Greetings from Sunnyside Camp in Sylvan Lake, AB ... where I will be speaking on missions shortly. Hope your summer is going well. Just wanted to write about two big praise reports, two major prayer requests, and an event update.

Praise Report #1: Ukraine





Pastor Edward & Wife

Pastor Edward Graduating

Pastor Edward was one of the first graduates from the church planting school we sponsor in Poltava, Ukraine (in fact I gave him his degree at graduation:). After grad he went on to plant a new church in a village outside Poltava called Malapereshepina ... that itself has since planted two other new churches.

The first week of July the conscription officers in Ukraine nabbed him off the street and put him in a holding room in the basement of the conscription office. Although pastors are sometimes exempt from the draft in Ukraine, since his church is new it is not registered yet and they wouldn't believe his claim to be a pastor. It looked like he was going to be shipped to the front line. So the Pentecostal Assemblies of Ukraine (PAOU) asked all their churches and their national partners - including the PAOC - to pray for him. The next morning, while he was being held in the basement, this happened ...



The building was hit by two Russian Shahed drones and completely destroyed. Miraculously, Pastor Edward was able to crawl out of the rubble and walk away from the building - completely unharmed! Then he thought to himself, "By law, I should report back there." So he went back to the area to let the army officers know that he was alive and still there. They looked at him in shock and said, "Just go man. You're free!"

Thankyou sooo much for praying! Thanks to your prayers the Lord spared Pastor Edward's life and freed him to go back and plant more churches in the Poltava region!

Praise Report #2: Kazakhstan

July 1-5 our global workers, Ilya & Jessica Batrakov, and Olya Dubyniuk (our youngest adopted daughter) led a camp for 46 kids, most of whom came from non-Christian/Muslim families.



Church Membership ...

What About Church Membership?

"I don't have to go to church to be saved. I don't have to belong to a church to be a Christian. I can worship God in my heart." Have you heard this popular dodge? It's sometimes difficult to refute because it happens to be true ... to a point. Nothing you do and nothing you can join makes you a Christian. The Bible makes it abundantly clear that Jesus is the only Way; that no-one comes to the Father except through Him.

Q: What does the Bible say about church membership?

A: The Bible is very clear that involvement in, and commitment to, a local church are essential for Christians. Throughout the New Testament the pattern of the Christian is to meet in local congregations (eg. Acts 2:46, 1 Corinthians 14:26, Ephesians 4:16, 1 Timothy 3:15). At some points we are commanded to do so (eg. Hebrews 10:25). Even Saul/Paul in Acts 9:26 – "When he came to Jerusalem he tried **to join** the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he really was a disciple." Having said that, it is true that the Bible nowhere **requires** membership in a church. In fact, in Biblical times there was no such thing. However, the Biblical principle is that the church is a family and a unit. The Bible speaks of the church as a family, or the household of God. Church membership is not like joining a country club; it is about joining an organic family. Church membership is a way of being accountable and becoming involved in the church and in demonstrating a commitment to Christ by participation in the church.

Q: I'm committed to our church, so what difference does it make if I am a member or not?

A: "Times have changed from years ago when you could have a loose relationship with the church. Our society and our laws have changed." There are a number of key differences between people who just attend with no strings attached and the actual church member. There seems to be a deeper sense of belonging and often a higher level of commitment from the people who step out and want to be members. They are more ready to shoulder responsibility and encourage the ethos of the church. Members have the right to vote at church business meetings. This is possibly not the most exciting thing you've ever been able to do, but it does allow you to have a say in what the church does and how it functions. Only church members can vote for deacons (lead team members) and Lead Pastor when a new lead pastor is to be called. Only church members can raise queries and make proposals about issues at a church business meeting. They are able to vote and add input to the sale or purchase of land or buildings for the church. If you would like to have a voice in the way that our church is run and the things that it does you need to have a vote, and to have a vote, you need to be a church member. A knowledge of which people are willing to publicly associate themselves with the church by becoming members assists the church leadership in planning and effectively running the church. If you are a member of another Pentecostal Church and you have moved here to Lacombe, you can have your membership transferred.

Q: How can I become a member?

A: See the Application for Fellowship on the next page or at the Welcome Desk. When you find yourself in agreement with those statements, sign and apply for membership and leave it in the office or with a staff member.

APPLICATION FOR FELLOWSHIP STATUS

Article 6 Membership

Section 1

Persons desiring to become members of this church shall give credible profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior. They shall give evidence of compliance with the Biblical standard of Christian practice and manifest spiritual growth by giving evidence of the Fruit of the Spirit: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22,23 NIV)

They shall refrain from acts of sinful nature: "... sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies and the like..." (Galatians 5:19-21 NIV) Sexual immorality shall be interpreted to mean common-law marital relationships, premarital and extra-marital sexual relationships (1 Corinthians 6:15-18, 7:1-2, 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8, Hebrews 13:4), and all forms of homosexual activity, along with other practices deemed inexcusable for Christian conduct, and which place a person under God's judgment (Romans 1:26-2:11).

They shall indicate a desire to live in harmony with this body of believers, shall accept the doctrinal standards as set forth in the *Statement of Fundamental and Essential Truths*, and shall be regular financial supporters of this local church.

Section 2

Membership shall consist of the following:

- 1. Regular Members. Persons 18 years of age and over who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 shall be known as regular members.
- Junior Members. Persons between the ages of 12 and 18 who fulfill the requirements of Article 6.1 may be eligible for junior membership. Such membership does not qualify for voting privileges at congregational business meetings.

What Is It?

- Baptism is a powerful, symbolic expression of the repentance that has happened, your acceptance of Christ as Lord and Saviour, and your commitment to being a dedicated disciple of Christ.
- It is a public demonstration of a person's union with Christ and His death and
 resurrection. It comes from the Greek Word "baptizo," which means to plunge,
 submerge or immerse. It signifies that a person's former way of life has been put to
 death (under the water) and points to their new life, saved and redeemed by Jesus
 through His resurrection (coming out of the water).
- Baptism does not save you. Salvation can only occur through the grace of Jesus Christ and His sacrifice on the cross.

Why Be Baptized?

Baptism is a step of obedience, faith and commitment.

- STEP OF OBEDIENCE: Jesus commands baptism for everyone who follows Him. Even Jesus, who had no sin, identified Himself with those who were repenting and was baptized.
 - Read Matthew 28:19, Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38, Matthew 3:16
- STEP OF FAITH: You don't need to have everything figured out to be baptized. The act of baptism is a step of faith in what Jesus has done and is continuing to do in your life.
 - Read Acts 8:35-38
- COMMITMENT: Baptism is an external act that signifies you are ready to embrace spiritual growth and transformation
 - Read 1 Peter 3:21
