- A. Christians—"Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness?"—2 Corinthains 6:14
- B. **Joyfully**—"So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. "— **Philippians 2:1–2**
- C. **Seeking**—"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."—**Acts 2:42**
- D. Christ
 - i. "that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ."— 1 John 1:3
 - ii. "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Let those of us who are mature think this way, and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you."—Philippians 3:14–15
- E. **Together** "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."—**1 John 1:7**
