Opening Prayer

Icebreaker

Question: What's one financial lesson (good or bad) you learned from your parents or family growing up?

Message Recap

Pastor Mike challenged us to think differently about money—not just the 10% we give, but the 90% we manage. He addressed why money is such a sensitive topic in the church and taught us how to approach God about finances with the right heart.

Key Takeaways

- Money is a spiritual issue Giving, budgeting, and debt are discipleship matters, not just financial decisions
- Money touches what matters most While money isn't the most important thing, it affects the things that are (family, home, provision)
- \cdot There's a biblical way to ask God for wealth The Prayer of Jabez shows us how
- Money has five God-given purposes To give to the kingdom, care for families, carry out our calling, help others, and enjoy life
- The greatest treasure is Jesus Before we worry about wealth, we must know the King of Kings

Discussion Questions

Section 1: Money as a Nerve

- Pastor Mike said money is one of the church's most sensitive "nerves."
 - Why do you think Christians get uncomfortable when money is discussed in church?
- 2. Have you ever felt convicted rather than just frustrated when hearing about giving? What was that experience like?
- 3. Read James 4:3.
 - How can we tell if our financial prayers have wrong motives?

Section 2: How to Ask God for Wealth

- 4. Review the four steps to asking God for more money:
 - 1. Check your motives
 - 2. Tell God how you will honor Him
 - 3. Don't be bashful about asking
 - 4. Be faithful with what you already have
 - Which of these steps is hardest for you personally? Why?
- 5. Read 1 Chronicles 4:9-10 (The Prayer of Jabez).
 - What stands out to you about how Jabez approached God?
 - How is this different from how we typically pray about money?
- 6. Pastor Mike said, "If you're not tithing over here [with little], you're not going to tithe over here [with much]."
 - Do you agree or disagree? Why?

Section 3: The Five Purposes of Wealth

- 7. The five purposes of wealth are:
 - 1. Give to the kingdom
 - 2. Take care of your families
 - 3. Carry out your calling
 - 4. Help others
 - 5. Enjoy life
 - Which purpose resonates most with you?
 - Which one challenges you most?
- 8. Read 1 Timothy 5:8.
 - How do we balance giving generously to the kingdom while also providing well for our families?
- 9. Pastor said some people are blessed with more wealth because "their calling requires it."
 - How does this perspective change the way you view others' financial blessings?
- 10. The last purpose was "to enjoy."
 - Why do you think Christians sometimes feel guilty about enjoying the blessings God gives them?

Section 4: The Greatest Treasure

- 1. Pastor ended by reminding us that Jesus is our greatest treasure.
 - How does keeping Jesus first change our relationship with money?
- 2. Read Matthew 6:19-21.
 - Where is your treasure?
 - How can you tell?
- 3. Is there anyone in the group who needs to surrender their finances to God for the first time? Or re-surrender an area where they've been holding back?

Practical Applications

This Week's Challenge:

Choose ONE of the following to implement this week:

Option 1: The Jabez Prayer

- Pray the Prayer of Jabez daily (1 Chronicles 4:9-10)
- Before praying, write down: your motives, how you'll honor God, and what faithfulness looks like with what you currently have

Option 2: Financial Inventory

- Take an honest look at your finances
- · Ask yourself: "Am I being faithful with what I have?"
- · Identify one area where you can be a better steward

Option 3: Kingdom Giving Assessment

- · If you don't currently tithe, pray about taking a step of faith
- If you do tithe, ask God if He's calling you to give beyond the tithe to a specific need or ministry

Option 4: Family Provision Plan

- · Review how you're providing for your family (1 Timothy 5:8)
- Make sure your family knows they're a priority, not just financially but with your time and presence

Option 5: Generosity Act

- Find one person or family to bless financially this week
- Give without expecting anything in return
- · Notice how you feel afterward (refreshed, as Proverbs 11:25 promises)
