Opening Prayer

Key Takeaways:

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How have you struggled with the question "Who am I?" in your own life?
- 2. Pastor Mike mentioned several ways culture defines identity (career, sexuality, achievements, etc.). Which of these have you found most challenging to overcome?
- 3. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17. What does it mean to be a "new creation" in Christ? How is this different from just being a "patched up sinner"?
- 4. The message stated, "Identity is not earned, it's received." How does this change your perspective on your worth and value?
- 5. Discuss the analogy of the caterpillar becoming a butterfly. How does this relate to our transformation in Christ?
- 6. How can we practically "reject false labels" that Satan or others might try to put on us?
- 7. Why is staying in community with other believers important for maintaining our identity in Christ?
- 8. Pastor Mike said, "Humility that's not in the power of Christ becomes weakness." What do you think this means, and how can we practice Christ-centered humility?

Practical Applications:

- 1. **Daily Mind Renewal:** Commit to spending time in God's Word each day this week, focusing on verses that speak to your identity in Christ.
- 2. **Identity Affirmations:** Write down 3-5 biblical truths about your identity in Christ and recite them daily.
- 3. **Community Check-in:** Reach out to a fellow believer this week to encourage them and remind them of their identity in Christ.
- 4. **Reject and Replace:** When you catch yourself believing a false label, consciously reject it and replace it with a truth from Scripture.
- 5. **Living Out Your Identity:** Choose one area of your life (work, home, relationships) and focus on reflecting Christ more intentionally there this week.

Closing Prayer:

Thank God for the secure identity we have in Christ. Ask for His help in living out this identity daily and seeing ourselves as He sees us.
