


The day is today! We are no longer at an age to postpone things.

Ramblings of the Ole Man

Someone asked me at the Senior Saint's cookout, and I believe it was Jerry Moseley, about what year my mama started bringing me to Calvary. I was born in 1959 and she and daddy lived in a duplex on Jefferson Street downtown. We then moved to 530 Whitaker Street, most likely in 1960, and that's when I started my trek at Calvary Baptist Church. Mama carried me in her arms to church since they didn't have but one car and daddy would be working on Sunday and had the car. I know I've said many times that I grew up here at Calvary. I have seen a lot of changes go on over the years and have seen a lot of folks come and go, not just to other churches, but go home to be with the Lord. Some of my earliest memories was the older part of the church where the office is now. The present nursery and class rooms for the little ones was the sanctuary back then. The choir loft was towards Aston Street, and there were pull walls where the counting room and the baby section is now for adult Sunday school classrooms. Then of course upstairs were classrooms for kids and teenage Sunday school. I don't recall where the Pastor's study was, or even if he had one. The parking lot was dirt and a big drainage ditch ran through it, which was the cause of many scoldings from parents after church for getting in it with your Sunday clothes and shoes on!! Where the social room is now sat Haggin's store. After Mr. Haggin's passed, Jack Parrish began running the store. May I say that was the cause of more scoldings due to us kids spending our Sunday school offering money on bubble gum and candy. Jack Parrish also had a pool table in the back of the store where my granddaddy introduced me to the game of pool unbeknownst to my mama and grandma because if they had known all heck would have broke loose. A lot of good games of pool were played in the back of that little store. Eventually the church bought the store and the house and did away with them. I sure hated to see that pool table go. The gym was built where Haggin's house was located. I remember when they built the sanctuary that we now have. Our family had moved over to Maple Street and as they where doing the framing I would pull my red wagon over to the church grounds and the carpenters would give me scrap blocks of wood. Whenever they would bend a nail I'd get them too and take them to the car shed at the house and straighten them out and use them for my blocks and make things only a youngin would think of. I later in life went to work for Jackie Conwell, an electrician who was the lead man wiring the church. I said something about going to the church when it was being built and he asked me if I was the little boy that used to come over and pick up blocks. Of course, it was me! Funny how things work out, ain't it?!!! I learned a lot from Jackie and wound up being his lead man doing electrical and plumbing. I loved wiring houses. New plumbing was alright, but I just loved wiring. As a matter of fact, the first house I ever wired by myself is right on the corner of Oakwood and Bolling Road facing towards Bolling Road. My help had laid out on me, and Jackie told me to just rough in the boxes and switches. He said he didn't expect me to pull wire alone. I took it as a challenge and when he pulled up to see why I was late coming in, I was pulling the last of the run of wire. The house was ready for the sheet rockers. He just smiled and went on his way. I remember the parking lot being paved, and then enlarged, and then paved some more. I can remember homecomings on the grounds outside under tents and the choir singing outside. They'd drag one of the old upright pianos outside and everyone would be gathered around it singing their hearts out. Some of the best food around was served in the heat and I don't recall anyone getting sick, but everyone got full of not only food but the Holy Spirit! I remember when the original fellowship hall was built and named after Mary Ellen White. I have already told y'all how much of an inspiration she was to me after I got saved. I thought about her the other Wednesday when we were talking about Heaven. I know beyond a shadow of a doubt that is where Mary Ellen is. I know that she is having the time of her eternal life with Jesus, no more epilepsy, and she is now whole! PRAISE GOD! I can't wait to see her. My mind is a flurry of memories of this place we call CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH and the people that have been here, served here, and, yes, died here!! Maybe next month, I'll have some more memories to share and let ya'll look into my minds eye, (scary I know), love y'all!
