Pastor's PERSPECTIVE

EMBRACING FAITH & COMMUNITY

Greetings Servant Faith Family!

Each month in the Connect, through the articles and the photos, you get a snapshot of what is taking place and what is to come here at your church. Yet, I know there are those in our family of faith who appreciate the photos and stories but are also "numbers people" and would like to hear some statistics on how their church is doing from time to time. With the numbers in for the first half of 2025, this seemed like as good a time as any!

In the first half of 2024 the average in-person attendance was 263. Through the end of June of 2025, the average in-person attendance sits at 317. This represents a 24% increase in attendance! Online, the average attendance for the first half of 2024 was 325. For 2025 the average attendance sits at 322. Know that we have made some adjustments to how we calculate online attendance so it's difficult to accurately compare those online numbers, but I would not be surprised if attendance has seen a slight decrease year over year. This would likely be in large part due to a number of individuals returning to in-person attendance since this time last year.

What about finances? In 2024, the first six months of general contributions, contributions given to support the general budget of Church of the Servant and not for a designated purpose, totaled \$616,083. For 2025 during the same period, those contributions totaled \$731,922. This represents a 19% increase in giving!

Both of these statistics, 19% increase in giving and 24% increase in attendance are amazing and represent your commitment to Church of the Servant. So Thank You! At the same time, we also know we have a long way to go to be who God has called Church of the Servant to be. Know that financially, even with the increase in giving, we are still operating at a deficit. Year to date our expenses have exceeded our income by \$134,181. Following a tumultuous number of years that led to a steep decline in participation at Church of the Servant, in 2024 your newly selected Leadership Team had a choice to make even prior to my appointment. They could dramatically slash the ministries, mission, and programming of Church of the Servant to meet the reduced resources or lean upon the Servant Foundation and the financial generosity of those who have come before to aid Church of the Servant through a difficult

time. They chose the latter which allowed the appointment of Pastor Sheri and myself, for staff to be maintained, and for God's Kingdom work at Church of the Servant to not only continue at its current level but increase as you've witnessed over the past year. But the Servant Foundation's resources are finite and Servant leadership, myself, and all of you know this is not a permanent solution and one that can likely continue for only an additional 2-3 years.

Now, if the growth we've experienced in the past year continues at a similar pace, then Church of the Servant is well positioned to be a beacon for God's Kingdom for years to come. But if that is to happen, it's going to take all of us. So what can you do? First, if you're in town and healthy, I'd love for you to join us physically in service. Each week we have new guests or returning Servant family members coming to see if the rumors of what God is doing in this place are true. It is difficult for you to welcome and show these individuals the hospitality and friendliness Servant is known for when you are not physically here.

For those of you who are unable to make it physically or live outside of Oklahoma City (or even the state!) please continue to join with us remotely on Facebook, YouTube, the Servantokc.org website, or Church of the Servant app. And feel free to interact with one another online while doing so. As you've likely noticed in recent months, Pastor Sheri has intentionally been in the online chat during the service. Feel free to tell her hello, leave a prayer request, or share how the service has touched your heart. We want to build a community online that mirrors the in-person community for those who are unable to physically be here on Sunday mornings.

Next, I do ask that you continue to support your church financially or prayerfully consider beginning to do so if you are not already. I know that there are many who have taken a wait-and-see approach, limiting their contributions or holding back entirely until they can see the direction Church of the Servant is headed. I hope these past six months you've witnessed the same fruit I have. Beyond encouraging numbers, I hope you've seen the fruit in the smiling children, in the comfort that has been offered as we celebrate the lives of loved ones, in the meaningful worship that has been experienced in person and remotely, in the lives that are being transformed through our participation in missions such as Meals on Wheels, Whiz Kids, Project Transformation, support of the Regional Food Bank and Skyline Urban Ministry, Deer Creek Comfort Closet, Rise Against Hunger, and so much more. If you've experienced the fruit of God's grace and love in this place, I humbly ask that you would support its continuation through your presence and your financial gifts.

Most importantly, I ask you to think about the people beyond the walls of our church. Those out there who long to experience the living Christ, who would benefit from Servant's unique brand of faithfulness. We provide an opportunity week in and week out for a diverse collection of God's children to gather around a very large table, see each other's faces, celebrate the Lord and offer God our praise. I am confident there are friends, family, neighbors, and people we have yet to meet who would be blessed by joining us at the table this and every Sunday. But this can only happen, will only continue, will only grow with your help. I look forward to coming alongside you and continuing to partner with the Lord in growing God's Kingdom this Sunday.

Here's What's Upcoming on Sunday Mornings!

We hope you have been blessed by our two summer series *Heroic* and *Praise-Tastic July*. As we move into the coming months, here is what you can expect during our Sunday morning Celebration Services for the remainder of the year:

Childlike Faith (August): As we return from summer vacations and children, youth, and young adults head back to school, we will be examining how we all might adopt the mindset of a child and discover opportunities for new learning and growth in our faith. This series will incorporate a number of stories and practices that, while seen by some as childish, may actually be instructive for all God's children.

Questions God Asks (September): We probably all have questions for God but how often do we stop and consider the questions God has of us? In fact Jesus, God in the flesh, often responded to questions from his disciples and others not with direct answers but with more questions for his listeners to consider. In this sermon series we'll examine stories where God asks the questions and consider just what a faithful response might be.

Naaman: In Search for God (October): In the Book of 2 Kings we read the story of Naaman, a commander in the Aramean army. He goes in search of healing for himself but finds much more. In this sermon series, we will learn alongside Naaman important lessons on how Faith may be simple in concept, but difficult in practice; anywhere can be Holy ground; and as servants of the Lord, we prioritize faithfulness, not prosperity.

Table Manners (November): Many of us can remember being taught table manners as children and hearing family members tell us repeatedly: elbows off the table, chew with your mouth closed, all four legs of the chair on the ground! In the Gospels, not only does Jesus often share meals with others, he also uses them as teaching moments. Join us during the month of November as we learn that how we behave around the table can also be an expression of faith.

Christmas Preparations (Advent): It's that time of the year when we all begin to prepare for the upcoming Christmas holiday as we put up the lights, bake special treats, tell our favorite Christmas stories, and turn on the 24-hour Christmas music stations. As we do, we not only prepare ourselves for the holiday, but to tell of and experience the birth


THE STRONGHOLD OF THE CHOSEN




THE GOD WHO SEES





SERVANT YOUTH



Our 2025-26 Whiz Kids program will begin with a gathering of all the priceless volunteers that make our Whiz Kids site possible on Thursday, August 28, at 2:00 PM at New Hope UMC, 11600 N Council Road! Whiz Kids Oklahoma is a nonprofit organization working to close the opportunity gap faced by elementary students through one-on-one literacy tutoring and faith-based mentoring at 27 different sites throughout the metro.

Whiz Kids embraces students identified by their teacher as having challenges learning to read. Our volunteers have the gift of coming alongside these kiddos, helping them with their reading skills so they can read to learn.

The program focuses on serving the whole child—academically, emotionally, spiritually, and physically—by creating a space where each child is known, loved, and nurtured, just as they are. Each of our students are reading below grade level, navigating inequitable systems and circumstances, and benefit immeasurably from a consistent, caring relationship with a compassionate adult mentor.

Of the 27 Whiz Kids sites in Oklahoma, ours is the largest. During the 2024–2025 school year, 94 % of our Whiz Kids improved their reading scores! Our site meets on Mondays after school. Our first wonderFULL day with our beloved Whiz Kids from Ralph Downs Elementary is Monday, September 8, 2025. We warmly and enthusiastically invite you to be part of our 28 life-transforming Mondays. That's right - just 28 Monday afternoons is the amount of time our volunteer tutors/mentors give to truly impact the life of a child that just needs a little boost to help them succeed.

And if 28 days sounds like too much, we have other opportunities that allow you to be part of our Whiz Kids! We really are in need of Substitutes that are able to step in and fill the gap when one of the tutors is unable to be there. As a substitute, you will receive tutor training and then be placed on our sub list. Tutors reach out to subs as the need arises. Serving as a sub is a great way to dip your toe into Whiz Kids. We really need to bump up our sub list this year, so thank you for considering helping in this way!







We also have three other teams that are integral in helping our kids learn to soar! The Transportation team either drives or rides in vans that go from New Hope to Ralph Downs Elementary to pick up our kiddos and bring them back to New Hope. The Set-Up team arrives before the students, and prepares our space for fun and learning, while our Cookie Team brings homemade cookies to New Hope that are passed out to the kids before they leave to go home - ending our time together on a sweet note!

If you choose to be part of one of these three teams, you will not serve every Monday. While serving on one of these teams may not be a huge time commitment, Whiz Kids couldn't happen without them.

"I cannot do all the good the world needs. But the world needs all the good that I can do." Please pray about becoming part of Whiz Kids. The investment of your time and compassion will forever impact the life of a child and our community! Come on! Let's see together what God will do!!!


