# Pastor Sheri's Notes

In 1974, a song was recorded in English, written by Terry Jacks, called "Seasons in the Son." I was 14 that year and found myself singing in a talent show in Jr High. I loved that song for some reason. I sang it in that talent show, and now, the words have been echoing in my mind:

"We had joy, we had fun, We had seasons in the sun, But the hills that we climbed, Were just seasons out of time."

As I sit and write this article, my 92-year-old father has gone to be with his Creator and left us only a few days ago. As I have been trying to help my mother care for

my dad for the past few months, we have been talking about seasons of time that we go through. For her, it has been a challenging season, yet one that she is glad to have experienced. She said Dad took care of us so very well, and now it's our season to take care of him.

We have many seasons in our lives, and all our lives are different, profoundly different from everyone else's. When my brother had a hemorrhagic stroke and we were at the hospital, the neurosurgeon said, "If you have seen one stroke, you have seen one stroke." If you have seen one life, you have seen one life. Every life is unique, and we experience different seasons; no two people's seasons are the same. If we are blessed enough to be able to care for a family member or a friend during a difficult season of their life, we should give thanks to God for the opportunity to serve.

The person receiving this service is blessed, we are blessed, God is blessed, and the Kingdom is furthered. I pray that we

each find our blessing in serving one or more of God's children. I give thanks that I was able to serve my earthly Father, my Mother, and my Eternal Heavenly Father.

#### HOSPITALITY

Well, it was answered this way: A visitor shows up, and is treated as an outsider, treated kindly perhaps, but still, as one who is not a part of. A guest is invited, shows up, is escorted to the finest accommodations, and treated as family.

We want to treat all those who come to us, with the greatest of hospitality. We are asking YOU to help!

- **1. We need Valet Drivers.** Yes, we park cars for those who ask. We need drivers to do the parking!
- **2. We need Door Greeters.** There are those who greet our members and guests alike, open the doors, welcome them in; we even give hugs if you want one!

- **3. We need Door Ushers.** These individuals stand at the doors to the Celebration Center, hand out the flyers with weekly information on them, count the participants in worship (including children), and escort guests to "Pew Buddies."
- **4. We need Pew Buddies.** These are all of you who are in the Celebration Center, who are agreeable to receive guests to sit with them. Pew Buddies work in tandem with Door Ushers.

If you can serve in any of these ways, please contact Patricia Hocker, or the church office. We will have an organizational meeting on Sunday, September 28, at 1:00 PM in Classroom 12. Note that you will be put on a rotational schedule and would not have to do these things every week, unless of course, you wanted to be on the list for every week! I pray that so many will be willing to participate in this ministry, so that every guest feels like they are wanted and loved by this church on behalf of the Kingdom.

#### **Enhancing Our Security Measures**

In light of the recent tragic church shooting in Minneapolis, which occurred during a time of prayer, our hearts are heavy with sorrow and concern. Such events remind us of the importance of vigilance and safety within our own community. It's natural to wonder, "What if this happened here at Servant?" While these thoughts may be unsettling, they underscore an urgent issue that cannot be ignored.

Our priority is to ensure the safety and security of our congregation, especially our children. For some time now, we have been making strides in developing a security team dedicated to this cause. We are grateful to the ten individuals who have stepped forward, but we are still in need of 14 more volunteers to complete our team.



PROGRAM UPDATE







There are so many ministries and missions at Church of the Servant, and It doesn't take much to find one that you can be a part of! But there is one that many might find unusual. It just goes to show that Church of the Servant goes all out when doing things to further the Kingdom for ALL of God's children.

The BRAS (Bras Recycled And Shared) ministry was started in December 2018 by a small group of women within our church. We provide not only bras to women and girls in need, but what comes of this ministry, is also a sense of confidence and self-worth. We collect bras from people who no longer want/need them, sort them by cup size and redistribute to not-for-profit organizations who provide the bras at no charge to their clients/customers. We also collect new, unworn underwear.

Since our first collection/donation, we have distributed just over 15,000 bras to women and girls in Oklahoma City. You will find a box in the alcove nearest EarthGlow market, marked as a collection box for these bras. Of course we are looking for all kinds of bras, and will take new ones, but we also take gently used, or nearly new bras. Tell your friends about our ministry! What an incredible opportunity to help other women and girls in a completely different way!

The following organizations receive bras. 363 (via Homeless Alliance), Bethel Foundation, Catalyst Rehabilitation, City Rescue, Mission House, Joe's Addiction, Palomar, YMCA Passageways, PIVOT, Remerge, The Sanctuary, Second Saturday, SISU, TEEM, WROK/TANF/SNA (via Public Strategies), and Integris Cancer Institute Wellness Center.

#### CARE MINISTRIES

#### **GriefShare**

Many things cause humans to grieve. Of course, losing someone by death is seemingly the most difficult. We grieve because we have loved. At Church of the Servant, we want to offer a safe place for those who need support through the grieving process, a place to talk, listen, and support one another.

We have begun a support group using the curriculum Grief-Share. A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief (in all its unpredictability) and gain solid support each step of the way,

"Each week GriefShare group begins with a 30-minute video featuring respected experts on grief-related topics and helpful stories from people who have experienced loss. Their insights will help you manage your emotions, gain clarity, and find answers to your questions as you walk through the grief process."

Mary Garrett, Marge Carmichael, and Rev. Sheri Lashley are facilitating this 13-week course. We meet on Thursdays at 1:30 PM in the Library. You may join the class at any time. When we begin, you can attend the sessions that you missed. #### **Joyful Callers**

Church of the Servant once had a thriving, large group of individuals, called Care Chaplains, that served by visiting those that were homebound, nursing home bound, or in the hospital. As time has gone on and many things have changed, we no longer have that group of people that participate in a visitation program. We are getting a group like that started!

Our new group will be called, "Joyful Callers." This group of individuals will receive a one-hour training, will visit those in homes, nursing homes, assisted living centers, and in hospitals. Visits will likely take about 5-10 minutes, and perhaps they will serve Holy Communion after a pastor has consecrated the elements. Rev. Sheri Lashley and Vicki Roberds will lead the short training, and the Joyful Callers will work closely with Vicki on organization of the visitors.

Our first training will be Tuesday, September 16 at 2:00 PM, and the second will be Thursday September 18 at 6:30 PM. Please let Vicki or the church office know if you intend to come, or if you would like further information. This is a much needed ministry at our church, as there is a great membership at our church, and our pastors are few!

#### **Notewriters**

One of the greatest ministries that we have at Church of the Servant, in ministry for and with each other, is our notewriters ministry. Perhaps you have been a recipient of this ministry and have received a sweet card in the mail, telling you that they are praying for you or thinking of you.
