



Discussion Questions:

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Describe a past or present situation of conflict you've been involved in. How was it resolved, if it was resolved?
3. What is the hardest part of a conflict for you? Repentance? Confrontation? Forgiveness? Or something else?
4. Are there situations when you've been able to simply overlook a hurt? What was that like?
5. What are one or two areas of sin with which you struggle? How do those sins affect your approach to conflict?
6. Is a critical spirit something you struggle with? How are you working to overcome it?
7. Describe a situation in which you've been involved (or that you witnessed) when both (or all) parties owned up to their contribution to the conflict.
8. How do you practice confession as a spiritual discipline? Privately? Corporately? What do you appreciate about it?
9. Describe a time you have had to confront a situation of conflict directly. How did the other party (or parties) respond?
10. For you, what is the hardest part of confronting a conflict?
11. Why did you choose to confront the conflict you mentioned? What, if anything, inspired you?
12. Is there anyone in your life right now whom you need to approach? How can we pray for you as you reach out?
13. Are there people in your life right now who may have "anything" against you? How can you reach out to them?
14. How hard is it for you not to keep "a record of wrongs" when people have hurt you? Why?
15. Describe a time when you were forgiven for a wrongdoing. What was that like? How did you respond?
16. Describe your most recent successes in resolving conflict. Who might be inspired by your success?
17. How can the group be praying for you?
