- ❖ Genesis 13-20
 - ➤ God's Covenant with Abram Gen 15
 - Father Abraham from Abram to Abraham, Covenant of Circumcision Gen 17
- **❖** Genesis 21-25
 - ➤ Birth of Isaac to Sarah (God promised in Gen. 17) when Abraham is 100 Gen. 21
 - Isaac and Rebekah (Gen. 24)
 - Birth of Esau (Edomites) and Jacob Esau sells birthright to Jacob Gen. 25
 - > Death of Abraham (Gen. 25) Abraham will ultimately have 8 sons

 - > Isaac sends Jacob to his Uncle Laban to find wife (marries sisters Leah and Rachel)

 - Good and Bad Gen. 30:14-18, Gen 37, Gen 35:22
 - Mandrakes, Saves Joseph, Sleeps with Bilhah (mother of his brothers Dan & Naphtali)
- Simeon & Levi
 - Gen. 34, Gen. 49:7
 - Both never get an establish/lasting territory they were scattered
- Judah (Gen 38)
 - His name is the basis for the term "Jew", comes up with the plan to sell Joseph, "Took" a Canaanite woman, his two oldest children were so wicked the Lord put them to death, slept with Tamar (his daughter in law) who bears Perez who Jesus descends from
- Issachar
 - ➤ Leah viewed him as vindication against her sister Rachel (whom Jacob loved)
- ❖ Zebulun
- Joseph
 - Favorite son, prideful, arrogant, truthful, faithful, slave, prophet, savior
- Benjamin
 - Rachel's son (she died at Benjamin's death)
- Dan & Naphtali
 - ➤ Born of Bilhah (Rachel's servant) Gen 30:1-5
- Gad & Asher
 - Sons of Zilpah (Leah's servant)

 - Sold into Slavery Gen 37
 - Remains faithful
 - Prisoner
 - Rises to power in Egypt
 - His administration makes Egypt wealthy
 - His family will come to Egypt seeking relief from famine
 - Shows Grace demonstrates the providence of God Gen 50:15-21
 - Married Asenath
 - Egyptian Daughter of Potiphera, Priest of On (or Heliopolis)
 - Name means "belonging to Neith" (Egyptian goddess) (KoP52)
 - > Two Sons
 - Manasseh
 - Ephraim






EXODUS

We should not lock ourselves from the outset into an excessively rigid, year-by-year chronological reconstruction. Instead, we should maintain a sensible amount of flexibility when it comes to specific dates. While creating intricate and specific chronologies is fascinating, it's also fickle. This history occurred some 3,500 years ago; without an ancient text or artifact patently identifying inarguably specific dates, it can be virtually impossible to settle on absolute dates for many events. Plus, new discoveries constantly require scholars to tweak and refine chronologies.

Ammenemes II 1929-1895 B.C.



Joseph sold into slavery 1899 B.C. during his reign

- Joseph imprisoned c.1889 BC
 - Joseph interpreted Sesostris II dreams
 - Rose to power as high govt. official under Sesostris II
 - Massive canal built at this time to connect the Fayyum basin w/the Nile (Bahr Yusef)

Sesostris II 1897-1878 BC

Sesostris III 1878-1843 BC







- Sesostris III
 came to throne
 at beginning of
 the 7 year
 famine
- Invited Jacob and his sons to settle in the eastern Nile delta
- Divided Egypt into three parts headed by a "Reporter" who were under one "Vizier" (Gen 47)

Ammenemes III

1842-1797 BC

- Joseph dies (1806 BC) at the end of Ammenemes III reign
- The great 12th
 Dynasty comes
 to a close with
 his death
