Get Oriented

What is mentoring or one-on-one discipleship? Read through the *Mentoring Definition and Understanding* document provided. Make sure you understand what it is we are doing and why. Ask clarifying questions as needed.



Who

Who can disciple someone else? Every believer who is consistently walking with the Spirit is able to disciple another believer. No believer is consistently mature, and we are all growing. Both the discipler and the disciple grow, since our focus is upon Christ and the Word of God. Both the mentor and mentee should enter this relationship with a desire to encourage each other in the Lord and submission to Him to grow to be more like Christ.



Let Me Know

It is life on life to be more like Christ.
