Class Summary: This lesson focuses on how men and women live biblically in a secular world looking specifically at ways to be faithful, Christlike, and evangelistic.

1. Introduction

Believers encouraged to live lives worthy of the calling to which they have been called. But what is that call exactly and how is it lived in the diverse spheres of life? Scripture is filled with examples of believers who lived to the praise of God's glory and they offer followers of Christ timeless principles for today's unique challenges.

4. The Guiding Principles: Faithful, Christlike, Evangelistic

4.1. The Patriarchs and Matriarchs: Hebrews 11

- a. Lived by daily faith (fearing the Lord) (11:3-12)
- b. Lived according to the revelation given to them (11:3-12)
- c. Held an eternal perspective (11:13)
- d. Lived in obedience to God's word/promises (11:14-31)

4.2. Daniel: Daniel 1-6

- a. Devoted to sanctification (1:8)
- b. Respected authority structures (1:8)
- c. Made known His submission to "the God of heaven" (2:28)
- d. Blameless in his work (6:4)
- e. Honored the King when able (6:10)
- f. Sought the Lord daily (1-6)

4.3. Paul: Mars Hill Acts 17:22-31

- a. Recognized the image of God in mankind (i.e. intrinsic worth of human life).
- b. He presumed upon their divinely oriented conscience. (See: Ecc. 3:11)
- c. He stated the need to seek/know God.
- d. He spoke in understandable (simple) terms. (See: 1 Cor. 2:1-5)
- e. He used culture and life context as a means to connect. ("I observe...")
- f. He waited for the opportunity as the Spirit led. (In Athens up to 3 months?)
- g. He spoke of Jesus. (Judgement and Salvation)



5. The Ambassador's Life in Christ

2 Corinthians 5:17-21 (NASB95)

¹⁷Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come. ¹⁸Now all these things are from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation, ¹⁹namely, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation. ²⁰Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Characteristics of an Ambassador: Statement of Affirmation

a.	Imago Dei:	bear the image of God among other image bearers. I represent Him in human interaction.
b.	Mission:	have been called to a life of knowing God, walking in His light, and making Him known.
C.	Message:	message is already written. My lifestyle is sanctified by the regenerate life of Jesus. Wholeness in Jesus is my message.
d.	Mindset:	life is not my own. My time is a gift. I have been set free to know and love God. I live with an ever-present consciousness of God's call before my speech, my activity and my interactions
e.	Method:	I present myto Him. I live a life ofto my God.
f.	Mastery:	There is no vsdivide in my life.

1. God loves you.

2. Man is sinful and separated from God.

3. Jesus is God's provision for man's sin.

4. We must individually receive Jesus.

Evangelism Explosion (EE)

Developer: Dr. D. James Kennedy

Organization: Coral Ridge Ministries

Summary: Trains laypeople to ask two diagnostic questions:

1. "If you were to die today, do you know you would go to heaven?"

2. "If God asked why He should let you into heaven, what would you

say?"

Way of the Master

Developer: Ray Comfort and Kirk Cameron

Organization: Living Waters

Summary: Uses the Ten Commandments to show people their need

for salvation, then points to Christ.

The Bridge Illustration

Developer: Popularized by The Navigators

Organization: The Navigators

Summary: Draws two cliffs (God and Man) separated by sin; the cross

forms the "bridge" between them.

3 Circles: Life Conversation Guide

Developer: Jimmy Scroggins

Organization: North American Mission Board (NAMB)

Summary: Three simple circles: God's Design → Brokenness → Gospel. Leads to repentance and recovery of God's design.

Two Ways to Live

Organization: Matthias Media

Summary: Six-part gospel outline showing two ways to respond to

Jesus:

1. God the Creator

- 2. Humanity rebels
- 3. Judgment
- 4. Jesus' death
- 5. Resurrection
- 6. Response (rejection or submission)

Summary: Teen-focused method using the G.O.S.P.E.L. acronym:

- 1. God created us to be with Him
- 2. Our sins separate us from God
- 3. Sins cannot be removed by good deeds
- 4. Paying the price for sin, Jesus died and rose again
- 5. Everyone who trusts in Him alone has eternal life
- 6. Life with Jesus starts now and lasts forever
