

Why do we need a comprehensive and cohesive understanding of the Bible?

# How does one establish a comprehensive and cohesive understanding of the Bible?

- Kevin DeYoung- "As a Christian I hope that my theology is open to correction, but as a minister I have to start somewhere. We all do. For me that means starting with Reformed theology and my confessional tradition and sticking with that unless I have really good reason not to."
- Christopher Cone- "A theological system ought to be the product of exegetical study of Scripture, not a preface to exegetical work... The bottom line is a simple one: we either submit to authorial intent regardless of the theological outcomes (recognizing that theology is an outcome, not a starting place), or we pursue an affirmation of a predetermined theological system with which we can be content. One is submissive to the Writer, the other is not."

If we are going to establish a comprehensive and cohesive understanding of Scripture that is derived from the text itself then there are some questions that we must answer from that text.

 Question #1- What method of interpretation should we use in able to establish a correct understanding of the text? What method does the text itself use?

- A case study in Genesis (Christopher Cone in *Priority in Biblical Hermeneutics and Theological Method*)-
- Passage Priority- "The primary meaning of any Bible passage is found in that passage. The New Testament does not reinterpret or transcend Old Testament passages in a way that overrides or cancels the original authorial intent of the Old Testament writers." Michael Vlach (page 29. Dispensationalism: Essential Beliefs and Common Myths: Revised and Updated)

### What is Dispensationalism?

"Dispensationalism is a biblical framework for understanding God's various dealings with mankind throughout history. Sometimes referred to as a philosophy of history, dispensationalism maintains that God has dealt with humanity on the basis of differing divinely expressed stewardships or administrations also called dispensations. As such, dispensationalists are known for framing their understanding of Scripture around those identifiable elements which serve to distinguish one dispensation from another." James Fazio

"Dispensationalism is a comprehensive and cohesive understanding of the Bible, the product of a consistent literal, grammatical, historical hermeneutic applied to Scripture. It recognizes that in His interactions from eternity past to eternity future, God works in different administrations, economies, stewardships, or dispensations. It is not a hermeneutic, an eschatology, or a theological construct." Dr. Christopher Cone

"Dispensationalism is a comprehensive theological system based upon a consistent grammatical-historical hermeneutic applied to all Scripture. It accounts for God's creation, kingdom, and covenant purposes and how these unfold in history from Genesis 1 through Revelation 22. It also explains how Israel, the nations, and the church relate to God's purposes." Dr. Michael Vlach

"A dispensation is an administration of a household, whereby a steward is appointed to manage his master's goods in order to yield a surplus, for which he will ultimately be judged according to his faithfulness as a steward." James Fazio
