Grace Group Discussion Questions
"At One Table: Reclaiming the Unity
and Love of the Lord's Supper"
(1 Corinthians 11:17-34)

Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

### **Observation (What Does the Passage Say?)**

- 1. What are the issues Paul identifies with the Corinthians' conduct during the Lord's Supper?
- 2. What specific behaviors during the communal meals does Paul criticize?
- 3. Describe how Paul explains the bread and the cup during the Lord's Supper.
- 4. What consequences does Paul mention for those who partake in an unworthy manner?

### Interpretation (What Does It Mean?)

- 1. Why does Paul emphasizes unity and respect in the context of the Lord's Supper?
- 2. What does Paul mean by receiving the bread and cup in an "unworthy manner"?
- 3. How does recounting of Jesus' actions during the Last Supper add to the importance of the sacrament?
- 4. What implications might Paul's warnings have for the Corinthians' spiritual lives?

# Correlation (How Does It Relate to Other Scripture Verses?)

- 1. How does this passage correlate with Jesus' teachings on community and fellowship? (Consider Matthew 26:26-28 and John 13:1-17)
- 2. How does this teaching about Communion reflect the principles laid out in Acts 2:42-47?
- 3. Compare Paul's teaching on self-examination before the Lord's Supper with David's prayer in Psalm 139:23-24.

#### Application (How Can I Apply It to My Life?)

- 1. How can I prepare myself spiritually to partake in the Lord's Supper?
- 2. In what ways can I contribute to unity and mutual respect in my church community, especially during Communion?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you felt particularly connected to the community during Communion. What made that experience meaningful, and how can you help recreate that for others?

### Response (What Is My Response?)

- 1. What has been your personal approach to the Lord's Supper before studying this passage? Has your perspective changed after studying these verses?
- 2. What commitment can you make to improve the experience of the Lord's Supper for yourself and others?
- 3. How has the study of this passage affected your understanding of community and fellowship within the church?
