

Stewardship: Time & Spiritual Gifts Matthew 25:1-2, 10-13 (NLT)

God looks for people who are faithful stewards of finances, time, and spiritual gifts in their personal lives and in their service to God and others.

TIME: The Passing of Life. The same for everyone. It does not discriminate. Can't be saved or recovered. The most perishable and wasted.

¹ Then the Kingdom of Heaven will be like ten bridesmaids who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. ² Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. The five who were foolish didn't take enough olive oil for their lamps, but the other five were wise enough to take along extra oil. When the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep.

¹⁰ But while they were gone to buy oil, the bridegroom came. Then those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was locked. ¹¹ Later, when the other five bridesmaids returned, they stood outside, calling, 'Lord! Lord! Open the door for us!'

¹² But he called back, 'Believe me, I don't know you!'

¹³ So you, too, must keep watch! For you do not know the day or hour of my return.

A message from your Sacramento District Church of the Nazarene:

Across America and the world, pastors faithfully serve and love the people in their congregations. National research shows that most pastors are operating with limited financial resources to meet their families' current and long-term needs. Fortunately, God is bigger than church paychecks and has many ways he can provide for his shepherds through the generosity of God's faithful people. Galatians 6:6 says, "The one who receives instruction in the Word should share all good things with their instructor." The month of October (Pastor Appreciation Month) is an opportunity for you and your church to take seriously God's call to care for your pastors.

Here are some ideas for how you can participate during the month of October and beyond to show your love and support for our pastors:

FAITHFULLY PRAY

The best way to help your pastor and staff is to regularly pray for: Intimacy with God, Marital love and unity, Spiritual protection, Divine guidance, Emotional and physical well-being, Parenting skills, Genuine friendships, Financial provisions, Daily wisdom, Personal encouragement, Helpful mentors, Effective ministry, Time management, Quality study and prayer times, Helpful training, courses and books, and Leadership skills.

EXPRESS YOUR FONDNESS

Stop by the Connection Center to get a blank card and write each pastor a note to let them know how God is specifically using them to bless, help and teach you to follow God. Remember their birthdays and anniversaries with a card, gift or social media post.

FOOD, FELLOWSHIP AND FUN

Prepare meals or baked goods for them (ask about favorite meals or certain foods to avoid). Give them a gift card for restaurants, fast food or coffee shops. Give them food from your garden, orchard, hunting or fishing trips. Invite them to your home or a restaurant for a meal. Offer them sports, concert or event tickets. If you have a vacation home, timeshare, recreational vehicle or camping equipment, offer to let your pastor use it. Share frequent flyer miles for conferences, vacation, mission trips or holiday travel.

FREELY SHARE

Share your skills and time to help with any of the following items: Childcare, Auto maintenance and repair, Home repairs and projects, Haircuts and beauty treatments, Medical care like chiropractic, massage or physical therapy, Lawn and garden upkeep, Tutoring or lessons for children.

CONSIDER FINANCES

Faithfully give to your church, so your pastor and church staff can be properly compensated. Beyond the church salary, the Lord may prompt certain individuals to provide personal funding to help with any of the following items:

- Bless Your Pastor & Staff offering
- Marriage conference or retreat costs
- Christian camp fees
- Mission trips
- Lessons or tutoring
- Family or couple's vacation or getaway
- · Pastor's conference, seminar or training
- Seminary courses
