Part 2: Which Gospel Do You Believe?

Context: Something is broken in our understanding of the Gospel

Question: How many "gospels" are there?

Caution: Many of these "gospels" have elements of truth in them.

There are at least six "gospels" in modern society:

- Tagline: "God loves you and forgives you no matter what."

Outcome: Discipleship is optional and passivity becomes sanctified

- Tagline: "Help the needy."

Outcome: Truth is relative and culture is accepted and accommodated

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 Tagline: "Claim your rights; God blesses with health and wealth."
- Outcome: Entitled selfish people who feel they can manage God.
 Tagline: "Follow your heart and God will meet your needs."
- Outcome: Self-indulgent and impatient people who idolize their own desires.
 Tagline: "Be right and win the argument at all costs."
- Outcome: Theological swagger resulting in detachment, "haughtiness"
 Tagline: "Follow me." Outcome: Active followers of Jesus intent on learning about Jesus and living as
He did to participate in the coming Kingdom of God.
