Part 5: Overcoming Obstacles

Context: Being a disciple of Jesus involves committing to processes that produce meaningful outcomes.

Process: Disciples should regularly practice

- Recognizing our heart problem: sin (Romans 3:1-21, Ephesians 2:1-10)
- Realizing our need: we can't fix ourselves (Romans 7:15-25)
- Reflecting on Christ's impact: we are reborn (John 3:1-14, 2 Corinthians 5:17-21)
- Reacting to the Holy Spirit's leading: listening and responding (John 16:7-15)
- Responding Biblically day-to-day: repentance, growth and change are normalized (2 Peter 1:3-15)

Outcomes: Disciples should increasingly see (John 15:1-13)

- Regular communication with Christ
- Consistent production of "fruit"
- Faith-filled decisions to obey
- Observable joy despite circumstances
- Tangible love for others

Evaluation: Metrics are not scoreboards but rather indications of change over time (2 Corinthians 13:5)

Obstacles: The battles disciples of Jesus fight are all addressed in God's word.
