
EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE GREENWICH POINT SUNDAY, APRIL 20, 2025 6:00 A.M.

One: Early in the morning, when the sun rose upon the empty tomb,

All: it brought a new day,
One: Everything was changed:
All: there was a new Creation.

One: God of resurrection,

All: by the light of Christ's rising,

One: raise us up to new life All: in the Spirit of Christ,

One: so that we can proclaim with all of creation:

All: Christ is Risen!
One: He is risen, indeed!

All: Let us worship our God of new life!

"Early in the Morning" - A Litany of Retelling in 5 Parts

adapted from Rev. Phil Letizia

This litary is a kind of prayer, beginning with "Lord God," and ending with "Amen." Throughout this prayer we will remind ourselves of our faith story—of Creation, Incarnation, Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Celebration—through scripture, word, and song.

1. Creation

Person 1: Lord God, early in the morning, when the world was young, you made life in all its beauty and wonder; you gave birth to all that we know: sky and seas; plants and trees; bodies of light in the sky; creatures of the land, water, and air; man and woman.

Person 2: In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. . . And it was so. God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. Thus, the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. (excerpts from Gen. 1 & 2)

One: God of new life,

All: We stand in awe of your creation and give you thanks, O Lord.

All creatures of our God and King lift up your voice and with us sing, Alleluia! Alleluia!

O brother sun with golden beam and sister moon with softer gleam: Oh, praise him. Oh, praise him. Alleluia! Alleluia!

Dear mother earth, who day by day unfolds rich blessings on our way, Alleluia, Alleluia!

The fruits and flowers that verdant grow, let them his praise abundant show. Oh, praise him. Oh, praise him. Alleluia! Alleluia!

O everyone of tender heart, forgiving others, take your part, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Christ bears your burdens and your fears, so, even in the midst of tears, Sing praises! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

2. Incarnation

Person 1: Early in the morning, when the world least expected it, a newborn child crying in a cradle announced that you had come among us, that you were one of us. The angels proclaimed it, the shepherds heard it, and in obedience . . . worshiped.

Person 2: Joseph went up to Bethlehem . . . with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." (excerpts from Luke 2:4-20)

One: God of new life,

All: We stand in awe of your incarnation and give you thanks, O Lord.

3. Crucifixion

Person 1: Early in the morning, surrounded by respectable liars, religious leaders, anxious rulers, and silent friends, you accepted the death you were given for our sake: You shouldered and suffered the cross, and with the words, "It is finished!" you put an end to hopelessness, giving instead hope in the promise of salvation and eternal life.

Person 2: When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One." (excerpts from Luke 23:33-38)

One: God of new life,

All: We stand in awe of your sacrifice and give you thanks, O Lord.

4. Resurrection

Person 1: Early in the morning, a voice in a guarded graveyard, empty cloths and footsteps in the dew proved that you had risen, that you had come back to those and for those who had forgotten, denied, and destroyed you.

Person 2: On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." Then they remembered his words.

When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. (Luke 24:1-11)

One: God of new life,

All: We stand in awe of your resurrection and give you thanks, O Lord.

EASTER MESSAGE Early In The Morning

5. Celebration

Person 1: Early in the morning, this morning, the body of believers gather together, one in faith and hope, one in purpose: To believe in and worship you, the one Lord, Jesus Christ, to live forgiven and thankful lives, and to celebrate the victory over death and the promise of eternal life.

Person 2: But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 15:57)

One: God of new life,

All: We stand in awe of your love that conquers all, and we join in the celebration! We give you thanks, O Lord! AMEN!

RISE AGAINST HUNGER MEAL PACKING EVENT - SUNDAY MAY 4 AT 10 A.M.


