“6. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come.”

(Matthew 24:6)

Week 1 - Introduction

Outline

- Why Study the Last Days?
 - There is a lot of misunderstanding amongst Christians
 - Wars, rumors of wars, natural disasters, political movements
 - All result in questions, confusion and fear
 - With each event many believers wonder – “Is this it?”
 - We're going to try to clear that up
 - And give you confidence and knowledge, not fear and confusion.
- Setting the Stage – What does the “Last Days” mean?
 - Also called the “End Times”
 - Generally considered to be the period of time just before the Rapture
 - The current Age of Grace
 - But an expanded view would include the Rapture, Tribulation, Second Coming, the Millennial Kingdom and the final Great White Throne Judgment
 - Basically everything from now until Eternity
 - The next event on the prophetic timeline is the Rapture
 - We don't know when the Rapture will occur
 - The Bible indicates no other events must happen first
 - But current world events point to it growing closer each day
 - We can't say for sure, but we may be living near the end of the Last Days
 - So we must be ready and sharing the gospel
 - The Last Days can be confusing, but we must not fear it

- Why are the Last Days Important?
 - When discussing the Last Days Jesus tells us, “...**whoever reads, let him understand...**” (Matthew 24:15).
 - The Last Days are a key part of God’s plan
 - They include specific events He recorded throughout His word
 - We need to understand what these events are so we don’t fear
 - Understanding God’s future plan is part of being a fully equipped believer
 - Understanding brings clarity and connectivity between Old Testament and New Testament prophecy
 - We also need to understand the critical role of Israel in God’s future plan
- How will we study the Last Days?
 - We will apply a literal meaning of scripture.
 - The time allotted for this study only allows for a very high level survey
 - We will focus on key topics that seem to be the most confusing or cause the most fear
 - Each lesson will include an Outline and a Narrative
 - The narrative is intended to give you more information than will be provided in class
 - Lots of scripture references are provided to guide you
 - A more detailed understanding can be gained by reviewing “*Our Journey Through the Book of Revelation*” on our church website under “Resources” and “Bible Study”
- How will we address controversial topics?
 - We will provide a fair explanation of each major viewpoint
 - Then we will tell you which option we believe the Bible supports
 - We would suggest you avoid social media feeds related to the Last Days
 - They are often sensationalized and unBiblical

Week 1 - Introduction Continued

Setting the Stage

So what is meant by the term “Last Days”? Some consider it the time just prior to the Rapture, but for our study we’ll expand that definition to include the total period of time from the cross until the beginning of Eternity. In other words, we’ll look at the Last Days, also called the “End Times”, as the time remaining for mankind to exist on earth. Unfortunately, the Lord doesn’t tell us exactly when these events will occur which means there is often a sense of dread for those who are not students of Bible prophecy. They want to know what does “Last” really mean? When will it happen? How will it impact my family? How do I know if I’m ready? All of these, and many other questions can be answered by a thorough study of the overall sequence of events from the Rapture, through the Tribulation, to the Second Coming of Christ, the Millennial Kingdom and into Eternity.

*But whatever our level of understanding may be, we shouldn’t fear any of this. Nearly a third of God’s word focuses on End Times prophecy. Not to frighten us, but to equip us to be prepared and alert. As Jesus explains in Matthew 24:6, “**6. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come.**”. In other words, we should not be “...alarmed...” by the Last Days. Instead, we need to be alert, patient and eagerly awaiting for our Lord’s return. But how long will we have to wait? We simply don’t know but it draws closer every day. As Dr. David Jeremiah says, “We may not be at the end of the world, but we surely are at the world of the end.”. In other words, what we see happening around us today indicates time is drawing to a close.*

*At the very end of the Bible Jesus declares, “**20. He who testifies to these things says, “Surely I am coming quickly.”** (Revelation 22:20). But “...quickly...” doesn’t mean He’s coming soon from a timing perspective. It means He’s coming without warning, and that means it could happen at any moment. It also means we should be eager and ready for His return no matter how long we have to wait. But how long do we have to wait? Only the Lord knows. At the Ascension of Jesus the Apostles assumed Jesus would return immediately, “**10. And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, 11. who also said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.”** (Acts 1:10-11). Likewise, the Apostle Paul, when speaking to the Thessalonians, seems to indicate he felt the Lord’s return was imminent, “**17. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with***

the Lord. 18. Therefore comfort one another with these words.” (1 Thessalonians 4:17-18). But now, over two thousand years later we still wait patiently for our Lord's return at the Rapture.

But that's okay, because even though we don't know when these events will occur the Lord tells us to be alert and ready, “44. Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.” (Matthew 24:44). That means we are to be prepared, but not afraid, because when we are alert and prepared we grow closer to the Lord. Plus, as we wait for the Lord's return we have to remember God doesn't measure time like we do. To our Lord, “...one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day...” (2 Peter 3:8b), so Jesus is not slow in delaying His return. He is simply giving His lost creation every opportunity to repent, “9. The Lord is not slack [slow] concerning His promise [to return], as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.” (2 Peter 3:9).

All that said, current world events indicate we may be living near the end of the Last Days. Just look around at our society and you'll see many signs. Chaos, confusion, political posturing and progressive agendas seek to legitimize sinful actions not even considered plausible by prior generations. But most disturbing is the global rise in violent and open antisemitism. A phenomenon our post-holocaust society emphatically proclaimed “Never again” after World War II. But as students of God's word, and specifically End Times prophecy, none of this should come as a surprise. In fact, what we are witnessing today is simply a precursor to what the Bible says is yet to come. This includes the unprecedented focus on globalization, multinational currency systems, a world health organization and the recent and significant rise in worldwide antisemitism. Couple this with political unrest in America, the rise of Islam in Western Europe, Biblical illiteracy, the global reaction to the Covid pandemic, Iran's emerging nuclear presence, the alignment of Russia and China, events in Israel and even the progressive climate agenda, all point to the type of alignment that must occur to usher in the end of humanity described in God's prophetic word. Is this a doomsday prediction or fear mongering? Not at all. It is simply being aware of what the Bible says and alert to what we see happening around us.

The next prophetic event to occur will be the Rapture. But we don't know when the Rapture will occur but indications are no other Biblical prophecies that need to be fulfilled first. Key to this is the fact Israel is back in her land, she is prospering, and surrounded by her enemies. This condition sets the stage for events to occur during the Tribulation which are focused primarily on Israel. But as the Rapture draws near we need to remember, although God's timing is not like our timing, the outcome is predictable because the Lord has already given us clues to follow.

After the Rapture the antichrist will rise and usher in satan's plan for world dominance. He will initially emerge as a peacemaker who establishes a seven year treaty with Israel. But in the middle of the seven years, the antichrist will violate the treaty and seek to destroy them as a nation and turn on anyone else who chooses to follow Jesus, "**7. It was granted to him [the antichrist] to make war with the saints and to overcome them. And authority was given him over every tribe, tongue, and nation. 8. All who dwell on the earth will worship him, whose names have not been written in the Book of Life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.**" (Revelation 13:7-8). We need to pay close attention to the beginning of verse 8 which says, "...**All who dwell on the earth will worship him...**". The term "...All..." indicates that during the Tribulation all people, all nations, and all governments will not only follow the antichrist but "...**will worship him...**". That means between now and the emergence of the antichrist the whole world will need to be in the right mindset in order to worship him and agree to his platform for the destruction of Israel and followers of Jesus. But getting the world in that mindset will take time. It will require a globalist agenda, progressive thinking, extreme antisemitism, corrupt officials at every level, and a total mindset change for society to be anti-God. This is the path mankind must be on in order to get to the point they accept the antichrist as their leader, and it is the glideslope we see materializing today as our society grows darker and more deviant. It is also the glideslope currently drawing millions away from the true gospel of Jesus to the lies of satan. But this has to happen too as Paul tells us In 2 Thessalonians 2:3, "**3. Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin (the antichrist) is revealed, the son of perdition.**". As part of this glideslope a "...**falling away...**" must occur first. This is not a falling away of the lost. They have already fallen. It will be a falling away of those who claim to be Christians but do not truly know Jesus as their Savior (see Matthew 7:21-23). We see this happening today as aberrant and heretical "gospels" draw well-meaning people to a self-focused "feel good" platform rather than Christ focused salvation through the blood of the Lamb. It may also represent a falling away from accepted and Biblically based moral standards to a point when things like abortion or gender fluidity are viewed as "normal". The catalyst for this spiritual and moral decline is found in today's progressive agendas and a mindset that seeks to, "...**call evil good, and good evil...**" (Isaiah 5:20).

So what does all that mean to the followers of Jesus? What we see happening in the world today is the moral glideslope mankind must be on to eventually fall to a place where they will accept the antichrist. How long will that take? We simply don't know. But indications are more clear every day that the world is headed in that direction at a fever pitch. But more importantly, as the church, we have been warned. Prophecies related to the Last Days are found throughout the Bible and point to a terrible time in the future when satan will make a last ditch effort to supplant God and rule the world. Of course he will fail, but not before dragging most of the world to hell with him.

The good thing is most of this will happen after the Rapture of the church, when we will be taken home to be with the Lord. The Lord confirms this in Revelation 3:10-11 when speaking to the faithful church, “10. Because you have kept My command to persevere, I also will keep you from the hour of trial which shall come upon the whole world, to test those who dwell on the earth.”. Paul further clarifies this in 1 Thessalonians 5:9, when he tells us, “For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.” As followers of Jesus we will not suffer God’s wrath, because our wrath was paid for on the cross.

Because of that promise we should not be afraid of what we see. Jesus has given us clear indications of what is to come so we can be prepared. He does this through God’s revealed word which tells us about the events that will occur in the future, “...See, I have told you beforehand.” (Matthew 24:25). Unfortunately, we don’t know exactly when that will be, but we know for certain it will happen. That’s why we should be encouraged by what we see happening around us. But don’t misunderstand. The fall of our society into immorality is tragic and heartbreakingly, but it follows a pattern we see in God’s word. In other words, it’s part of His plan, so it doesn’t take Him by surprise and it is required before Jesus will return. That fact shouldn’t depress us or scare us. Instead, it should energize us because we see God’s hand in this and can see prophecy being fulfilled. That means there is no greater time to be deeply in God’s word and seeking His wisdom than today. It is only through being in the word and in prayer that we will, “Take heed that no one deceives you...”. (Matthew 24:4b).

It’s certainly difficult to watch society fall apart and not be concerned. That’s understandable. But we should not fear what is coming. When Jesus told His disciples about the Last Days He warned them of mankind’s future fall, “But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only. But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be.” (Matthew 24:36-37). Here Jesus warns us the Last Days will be, “...as the days of Noah were...”. But what does that really mean? The word tells us in Genesis 6:5, “5. Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.” Note what this verse says. In Noah’s time, “...every intent of the thoughts of his [man’s] heart was only evil continually...”. Taking that and applying it to what Jesus said of the future means the core thoughts of man will be “...evil...” all the time. That means a time is coming when even the innermost “...thoughts...” of man will be “...evil continually...”. This is a recipe for continuous and unrepentant sin. Our society is not there yet, but we can certainly see it headed that way.

So where is Southside in all of this? Frankly, we’re the point of the spear. Every day we see clear evidence of the “...falling away...” as mankind and the self-proclaimed


“church” slide down the glideslope of sin and tolerance as it teeters on the edge of destruction. As we watch, mankind is falling into sin and the “church” is right behind them as they seek to be relevant. But we, the faithful Bride, who follow our King Jesus, who seek to preach God’s word and the true gospel, who seek to understand and follow solid Biblical doctrine, who are alert to what God has already told us and are patiently waiting for His return. We are the faithful who will prevail.

And in the meantime, “...but see to it that you are not alarmed...”. (Matthew 27:6b)

God's Prophetic Timeline

Note: In the Appendix you will find a more detailed timeline of Biblical events, but for the purpose of this survey the chart below focuses on the major events associated with the Last Days from the Cross to Eternity

A View of the End Times God's Timeline of Prophetic Events From the Cross to Eternity



Brief Explanation of Timeline Events

- The Cross
 - The death and resurrection of Jesus (John chapters 19-20)
- The Ascension
 - Jesus returns to heaven (Acts chapter 1)
 - After the Ascension the Holy Spirit indwelt believers and began the “*Age of Grace*”, also called the “*Church Age*”. (Acts chapter 2)
- 1948
 - Israel reestablished as a nation (Deuteronomy 30:1-10)
 - This is critical to End Times prophecy
- The Rapture
 - When Jesus will return in the air to gather His bride (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)
- The antichrist emerges
 - At some point after the Rapture the antichrist will emerge and establish a seven year treaty with Israel (Daniel 9:24-27 / Revelation 6:1-2).
 - This signifies the start of the Tribulation.
 - The antichrist will then create a worldwide empire of sin (Revelation 13:1-10)
- The Tribulation
 - A seven year period when God seeks to draw Israel to the Messiah Jesus and brings judgment on the whole earth. (Daniel 9:20-24 / Revelation chapters 6-19)
- The Second Coming
 - The physical return of Jesus to the earth as the Warrior King (Zecharia chapter 12 / Revelation 19:11)
- The Millennial Kingdom
 - A one-thousand year period when Jesus will reign on earth (Revelation 20:4-6)
- The Great White Throne Judgment
 - The final sentencing of lost mankind to hell (Revelation 20:11-15)
- Eternity
 - When all believers will dwell with God forever in the New Heaven, New Earth and New Jerusalem (Revelation chapters 21-22)

Week 2

The Difference Between the Rapture and the Second Coming

The Rapture

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17

“16. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.”

The Second Coming

Revelation 19:11

“11. I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. With justice he judges and wages war.”

Week 2 - Outline

- Let's clarify something Right Upfront
 - The Rapture and the Second Coming are not the same event
 - They are different events, at different times and for different reasons
- What is the Rapture?
 - The return of Jesus in the clouds to gather His bride (the Church / the Body of Christ)
 - 1Thessalonians 4:16-17
 - Who is the Rapture for?
 - What will happen?
 - When will it occur?
- What is the Second Coming?
 - The return of Jesus to earth for final judgment
 - Revelation 19:11
 - Who is the Second Coming for?

- The major difference between the Rapture and the Second Coming is seen in their Proximity and Purpose:

- The Rapture
 - Proximity - Jesus returns in the clouds
 - Purpose - To gather His bride
- The Second Coming
 - Proximity - Jesus returns and stands on the earth
 - Purpose - To destroy satan and the remnant of mankind who refuse to accept Christ
- Why is this difference important?
 - They are two separate events for two completely different purposes
 - But they are often confused
- What are the most commonly held views about when the Rapture will occur relative to the Tribulation Period?
 - Pre-Tribulation Rapture (or "Pre-Trib.")
 - The church is removed before the Tribulation begins.
 - Mid-Tribulation Rapture (or "Mid-Trib.")
 - The church is removed at the 3-1/2 year mid-point of the Tribulation.
 - Pre-Wrath Rapture (or "Pre-Wrath")
 - The church is removed after the 3-1/2 year mid-point but just prior to God's final wrath
 - Post Tribulation Rapture (or "Post-Trib.")
 - The church is removed at the end of the Tribulation
- Which option do we believe the Bible teaches?
 - Pre-Tribulation Rapture
 - The church is removed before the Tribulation begins
 - Supported by Revelation 3:10 and 1 Thessalonians 5:9
- What do we see happening to indicate the Rapture is near?
 - Israel is back in her land
 - Israel is prospering
 - Israel is surrounded by her enemies
 - Wide spread and open antisemitism
 - Mankind on the glideslope of immorality
 - All of these are precursors to the Tribulation
- How do we prepare?

 - But also in many Old Testament and New Testament References
 - The Tribulation did not happen in the past
 - It is not happening now
- Why will there be a Tribulation?
 - To draw Israel back into obedience
 - When they will finally recognize Jesus as the Messiah (Zechariah 12:10)
 - To rid the world of satan and his followers
 - But also, to give mankind multiple opportunities to repent
- When will it occur?
 - At a point in the future
 - After the Rapture
 - Prior to the Millennial Kingdom
- What will happen?
 - Emergence of the antichrist
 - A one world government, economy and religion
 - Twenty-one judgment actions by God
 - The Second Coming of Jesus
 - The destruction of satan and the current heavens and earth

- What needs to happen first?
 - The Rapture
- How will it start?
 - Jesus will release the first “Seal” judgment
 - And the antichrist will emerge
 - The Seal judgments will be followed by "Trumpets" and “Bowls”
 - For twenty-one total judgements
- How will it end?
 - Jesus will return as the Warrior King and Judge
 - The Battle of Armageddon
 - Then Jesus will then usher in the Millennial Kingdom

Appendix God's Prophetic Timeline

Timeline Overview:

The timelines shown here are fairly self-explanatory. They begin with Genesis and end at the beginning of eternity in God's New Heaven, New Earth and New Jerusalem. Between those bookends are many scriptural references and events that in one way or another provide a connection between End Times prophecy and its fulfillment.

Chart 1 - Creation Through Silence

This chart covers several thousand years from the time of God's initial creation through the end of the *"Intertestamental Period"* between the Old Testament and New Testament. It starts with our first view of Jesus in Genesis 1:1-2 (see also John 1:1-14). From there it highlights scripture related to key events or Biblical prophecy. The beginning of the chart shows the emergence of sin and the curses that followed (on satan, on man, on the earth). We will see reference to this all through the Bible culminating in the completion of the curses in the Book of Revelation. The top half of the chart tracks the emergence of Israel, the Law, the first blood atonement and the Prophets. The bottom half highlights events such as the flood and the critically important prophecy of Daniel. This page ends at the 400 years of silence between the ministry of Malachi and the arrival of John the Baptist.




Chart 2 - The Prophet John Through the Rapture

The Bible doesn't tell us how long this time period will last because it covers the time from John the Baptist (the last Messianic Prophet) announcing the arrival of the Messiah, through the current Age of Grace and then to the future Rapture. Certainly, events seem to be lining up for the Rapture to occur soon but the exact timing is up to God. This chart covers the life of Jesus which was the fulfillment of over 300 prophecies in the Old Testament related to the earthly life of Christ.




Chart 3 - The Beginning of the Tribulation




Chart 5 - The Millennial Kingdom Through Eternity
