IN THE CAR:

On the drive home, ask your child what he learned about this week:

When God gives us a message, can we count on it to be true? Yes! God speaks through angels, the Bible, and the Holy Spirit. As long as it measures up to God's word, we know that it is true. God always does what He says He's going to do. Zechariah had doubts. Luke 1:5-25, 57-66, The Coming Birth of John the Baptist



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kid if they have any doubts about God and if they would like to look in the Bible with you to learn God's truth. Ask your kid what can get in the way of having a strong faith in God.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

When the Gabriel spoke to Zechariah, what did the angel tell him would happen?

Did it come true?

Why do you think Zechariah had a hard time believing?

Is anything impossible for God?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news. It will bring great joy for all the people." Luke 2:10



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

Angels played a huge part in the story of the birth of Jesus! In this series, we will investigate what each of their appearances can tell us about what's important to God.
