Background of Early Christianity by Everett Ferguson:

"a secret rite by which selected individuals were brought into a special relationship with a deity and assured of certain benefits."

"initiate was given the special protection of the divinity by means of the ceremonies themselves, which worked automatically, and these ceremonies and their privileges were the exclusive property of a small group."

[&]quot;his master conferred on him three benefits: knowledge of Greek customs, ability to read, and initiation in mysteries."
