- 1) spiritual gifts are special endowments of grace, in the form of supernatural abilities or capacities;
- 2) these gifts are given to each individual saint uniquely, making each saint therefore necessary to the overall body;
- 3) these gifts are diverse in nature although unified in their object and purpose;
- 4) these gifts manifest themselves through ministries to Christ's church for its benefit;

- 5) these gifts produce certain effects in the church orchestrated by the Father;
- 6) some of the gifts were intended as short lived experiences in the church for its foundation and others for its ongoing growth.
