Discipleship Training Course Guidelines

Mode of Operation

- The course is spread over 6 months with both in-person and online teaching and discussions
- The course structure is divided into four modules:
 - Module 1 - Discipleship and its impact on the church
 - Module 2 - Biblical Doctrine
 - Module 3 - Spiritual Discipline
 - Module 4 - Practical Discipleship

An overview of each module will be provided
- Modules 1 -3 will be In-Person at Gateway House, and the modules will be spread over three Saturdays: -
 - January 31
 - February 28
 - March 28
- Each class runs from 10 am to 4 pm, and lunch and refreshments will be provided
- Classes will be conducted in a lecture style, with a PowerPoint presentation. The lecturer will engage students periodically and seek their involvement. Every student is encouraged to participate actively
- Module 4, Practical Discipleship involves discussions and teachings on the following: -
 - Group Study and Discussion on the Book of Luke –
 - The Life of Jesus
 - The Ministry of Jesus
 - Mode of His Discipleship
 - Group study and discussion on the Book of Acts –
 - Role of the Holy Spirit in the early church
 - The early church spread of the Good News
 - The power of God in the life of a disciple
 - Group Discussion on Meditation and Studying the Bible
 - Prayer Meeting with the WAIT Team

- Evangelism Training with the Evangelism Team
- Biblical Economy Teaching
- Finding Your Voice Teaching
- Praise and Worship Experience Teaching
- Project – Students are to write a minimum of 1,000-word dissertation on one of the following topics:
 - 1) The Contribution of Discipleship Graduates to Ministry Effectiveness and Church Life
 - 2) From Formation to Function: The Role of Discipleship Graduates in Building a Healthy Church Community
 - 3) Discipleship and Missional Engagement: Assessing the Impact of Formed Believers on Outreach and Community Transformation
- Practical Discipleship discussions and teachings will be online every Wednesday, from 4th of February to 24th of June, from 7.30 pm to 9.0 pm. There will be Breakout rooms for group study and discussions. Students will be divided into groups of mixed levels of spiritual maturity.
- **Evangelism** – All Discipleship students must attend at **least 3** of the forthcoming 2026 Community Outreaches

- **Prayer (With the WAIT Team)** - All Discipleship students must attend at least 4 of the forthcoming 2026 WAIT Team Meetings

Sunday - 19 Apr, 26 Apr, 10 May, 17 May - (Online 8.0 am – 9.0 am)

Assignments

- Lecturers will give assignments from time to time and will inform you when to submit them.

- All teaching sessions will be recorded on audio tape, and will be available for purchase at a discount
- Students can record in class and take photos of slides if they wish
