1.	When someone serves you, be, not				
	(Philippians 2:4-5 TLB) Don't just think about your own affairs, but be interested in others too, and in what they are doing. Your attitude should be the same as that of Jesus Christ,				
	 Wives – (1 Peter 3:4 NCV) No, your beauty should come from within you—the beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit that will never be destroyed and is very precious to God. Husbands – (1 Peter 3:7) Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect 				
2.	When someone disappoints you, be, not				
	(Galatians 6:1 TLB) Dear brothers, if a Christian is overcome by some sin, you who are godly should gently and humbly help him back onto the right path, remembering that next time it might be one of you who is in the wrong.				
	(Romans 14:1 EHV) Accept a person who is weak in faith, and do not pass judgment on things that are just a difference of opinion.				
	(Romans 15:7) Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God.				
3.	When someone disagrees with you, be without				
	(Proverbs 15:1 GN) A gentle answer quiets anger but a harsh word stirs it up.				



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(James 3:16-17 GN) Where there is jealousy and selfishness, there is also disorder and every kind of evil. But the wisdom from above is pure first of all; it is also peaceful, gentle, and friendly...

(2 Timothy 2:24-25 MSG) God's servant must not be argumentative, but a gentle listener and a teacher who keeps cool, working firmly but patiently with those who refuse to obey. You never know how or when God might sober them up with a change of heart and a turning to the truth, enabling them to escape the Devil's trap, where they are caught and held captive, forced to run his errands.

	(James 1:19 Ph) Let everyone be quick to listen, but slow to use his tongue, and slow to lose his temper.
	(Proverbs 13:18 NCV) A person who refuses correction will end up poor and disgraced, but the one who accepts correction will be honored.
	(James 1:21 NCV) So put out of your life every evil thing and every kind of wrong. Then in gentleness accept God's teaching that is planted in your hearts, which can save you.

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	(1 Peter 2:23 NCV) People insulted Christ, but he did not insult them in return. Christ suffered, but he did not threaten. He let God, the One who judges rightly, take care of him.
	(Romans 12:17, 21) Do not repay evil for evil Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
	(Proverbs 16:32 NKJV) He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his own spirit, than he who captures a city.
