- Respond promptly to direction and adapt to changes as needed.

#### 3. Stay Engaged

- Remain attentive throughout the service, anticipating transitions and upcoming tasks.
- Avoid distractions to ensure you're ready for cues at the right time.

### 4. Serve with Excellence

- Perform your role to the best of your ability, focusing on clarity, consistency, and intentionality.
- Aim to eliminate distractions so people can focus on worship and the message.

## **Role-Specific Standards**

#### 1. Sound Tech

- **Soundcheck**: Lead the worship team through soundcheck, checking gains, EQ, and ensuring a balanced mix for each instrument and vocal.
- Mixing: Create a clear and worshipful mix using EQ, compression, and effects as needed.
- **Attention to Transitions**: Adjust audio levels dynamically to match the flow of worship, speaking, and videos.
- Troubleshooting: Address feedback, static, or other sound issues quickly and effectively.

### 2. Lighting Tech

- **Cues**: Execute pre-programmed lighting cues in alignment with the order of service.
- **Focus on Transitions**: Ensure smooth transitions between lighting looks (e.g., pre-service, worship, speaking).
- Clarity and Consistency: Maintain consistent lighting to highlight the stage appropriately for worship, speaking, and video moments.
- **Preparation**: Test lighting equipment before the service to ensure functionality.

### 3. Camera Operator

- **Dynamic Shots**: Capture intentional and clear camera angles that enhance the worship experience for both in-person and online audiences.
- **Follow Direction**: Respond to the Video Director's instructions promptly to maintain seamless transitions and storytelling.
- **Steady Focus**: Ensure shots remain steady, focused, and free of distractions.
- **Equipment Care**: Handle cameras and gear responsibly, reporting any issues immediately.

### 4. Video Director

- **Broadcast Switching**: Operate the video switcher for live streams, ensuring smooth transitions between cameras, graphics, and pre-recorded media.
- **IMAG**: Manage visuals displayed on in-room screens, including switching between live cameras and presentation slides.
- Communication: Direct camera operators and media techs to align with the service flow.
- **Focus on Engagement**: Use visuals to support worship and teaching moments without drawing attention to the technology.

### 5. Media Tech

- **ProPresenter Operation**: Execute all visual presentations, including song lyrics, sermon slides, and videos, with accuracy and timing.
- **Preparation**: Ensure all media elements are loaded and tested before the service.
- **Cues**: Follow the service flow to trigger each element smoothly and at the appropriate time.
- **Troubleshooting**: Address any ProPresenter or media-related issues efficiently to minimize disruptions.

## **Pre-Service Checklist**

#### 1. Team Communication

- Check in with the Production Lead and other team members to review the service flow.
- Confirm any updates or changes to the order of service.

### 2. Equipment Check

- Test all equipment (soundboard, cameras, lighting, ProPresenter) to ensure functionality.
- Confirm all visuals, slides, and media are loaded and ready.

### 3. Run-Through

- Participate in the rehearsal to practice transitions and fine-tune elements.
- Make adjustments to ensure everything is aligned and prepared.

### **Service Execution**

- **Stay Alert**: Pay attention to the flow of the service and anticipate cues before they happen.
- **Collaborate**: Work as a team to manage transitions smoothly and address any unexpected issues.
- **Focus on Jesus**: Remember that every element of production exists to point people to Jesus and support an atmosphere of worship.

# **Post-Service Wrap-Up**

- Review: Discuss what went well and any areas for improvement with the team.
- Equipment Care: Power down and store all equipment properly.
- **Celebrate**: Take time to celebrate the team's efforts and the impact of the service.
