EASTER THOUGHTS

With Easter 2024 occurring on the last Sunday in March, I suspect some of us can remember back when we were very young. We were told that the Easter Bunny would come bringing small gifts and hiding colored eggs in the yard around our house. In our early years, we easily believed in the Easter Bunny, the tooth fairy and other fairy tales made up to attract the attention and amazement of little children.

As we grew older, being brought up attending Sunday School and church, we soon learned the real Easter Story about God's Son (Jesus Christ) and how He came to provide a way for rebellious mankind to become right with God and obtain eternal life with Him in heaven when we die. God, however, required a penalty for mankind's rebellious/sinful nature and Jesus paid this penalty for us with His sacrifice on the cross. We have to believe, accepting Jesus' substitutionary penalty payment for us, and live so that others can see a Christlike difference in us (our Bible tells us even the demons believe but stubbornly oppose God's way).

As we matured and reached the age of accountability for our actions, we realized that the Christian Life is more than simply believing and living good lives. The Book of Matthew (28:19-20) records Jesus' commission to his disciples (after His resurrection from the tomb) to go out and spread His teaching to all nations (peoples), baptizing them and instructing them in the Christian way.

We as Christ's disciples in our time are tasked to do likewise. Some have the ability to preach and/or teach while others can best witness by their daily lives (in their speech, mannerisms, interactions and treatment of those we interface with). We should take advantage when opportunities present themselves in our conversations and interactions with family, friends, co-workers, etc. Silence is not usually "golden" in these situations.

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commended you: and, lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the world."
