Anchoring the Vision: The 5 Solas and Our Church's Vision

I have spoken often through the Vision Newsletter about our vision process for the future. This past month, we took a break from our walk with the Apostles in the book of Acts to look back at the roots of the Protestant Reformation. Regardless of your background in the Church, the one thing that unites Protestants is the Five Solas of the Reformation. These Solas (Latin for alone) were the central tenets argued for by the Reformers to address areas in which the Roman Catholic Church had erred. It was an attempt to renew the Church to its roots.

Revisiting the Reformation:

The Reformation was a transformative time for the Church, just as we are in a transformative time as a church.

- **1. Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)**: Our Church holds the Bible as the supreme authority in all matters of doctrine and practice. It's the compass by which we navigate our faith.
- **2. Sola Fide (Faith Alone)**: We believe that salvation is a gift received through faith and not by our own good deeds. It's a grace-filled reminder of God's unconditional love.
- **3. Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)**: Every moment we live is a testament to God's grace. Our salvation is not something we earn, but a gift given freely by God.
- **4. Solus Christus (Christ Alone)**: Jesus is the cornerstone of our faith. Through Him, we find salvation, purpose, and hope.
- **5. Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God Alone)**: Everything we do, both as individuals and as a church, aims to glorify God.

Deacon's Devotional



"Come, Follow Me"

In Matthew 19-16-22, the encounter of Jesus and the rich young man is recorded. The young man asked Jesus what he had to do to have eternal life. When Jesus told him to keep the commandments, the man replied that he had kept them since his youth—then asked what he lacked. Jesus then told him to go and sell his possessions and give the proceeds to the poor; then he would have treasure in heaven. Only after this was done, Jesus told him he should then come and follow Him. Upon hearing this, the young man went away sorrowful because he was very rich (and couldn't give up his love for his great possessions).

In Charles "Chuck" Colson's book, *Loving God*, I read, about a similar account involving a well-known Los Angeles mobster, Mickey Cohen. He was born poor in New York City and worked his way up in the style of Al Capone to become the mob boss in Los Angeles. His crime organization was reported to take in more than half a million dollars a day. Mr. Cohen was a flamboyant high-living individual who entertained well-known celebrities, politicians and many others who wanted to be well-known. He had a big home, a beautiful wife and was generous to his friends and people he liked. He once bought back a widow's home for her after she had been swindled (he also had his mob enforcers severely rough up the swindler). Although he was charged with several violent crimes (including murder) he was never convicted of any of them. It was a different story when he was later charged and convicted by the IRS of income tax evasion and given a five-year prison term.

Prior to his IRS experience, one of his organization's "employee" had come to him with the story of his conversion and accepting Christ during a Billy Graham Los Angeles Crusade. He told Mickey he could no longer work for him—that he had a new leader in his life. He sold his home and automobile to pay back a man he had cheated in a business deal.

Another of Mickey's former employees, who was a recovering alcoholic and just got out of prison, tried to get Mickey to accept Christ. Both of these former employees even got him to pray the sinner's prayer and thought there was some change in him. They were able to get him to hear Billy Graham preach to a small group, but when it became obvious that he really wanted the photographers to get his picture taken with Mr. Graham, they knew Mickey just wanted the publicity it would generate.

Later, when they told Mickey he needed to rid himself of his mob connections, he replied that they hadn't told him that he had to give up his career. Mickey said there are Christian movie stars, Christian athletes, and Christian businessmen—so why couldn't he be Christian gangster? If he had to give up all that—then count him out.

Just as that rich young man in scripture, Mickey Cohen couldn't give up his lifestyle. He died of cancer alone in his home, divorced by his wife with no news reporters, no dancing girls, no bodyguards. He had rejected Christ and died as poor as he had come into this world.
