Our Responding to God's Call with Vision and Courage

"Here I am. Send me." - Isaiah 6:8

Take a moment and picture our church logo. What comes to mind? Maybe it's the three black crosses, or our name in the Papyrus font. But here's the bigger question: When our community sees that logo—when they drive past our sign, visit our website, or walk through our doors—what do they see?

Do they see a church alive with hope?

Are You Tending Your Heart?

Many of us are tending our physical hearts due to medical necessity. We are seeing cardiologist and heart specialists for medications or treatments that help our malfunctioning "tickers". We do what we must to improve our heart health to remain alive.

But, what about our spiritual hearts? How are we tending them? Who's treating our faltering spiritual hearts so we may live abundantly?

The Bible warns that we must remain diligent to prevent a hard heart. "Tending the heart" is an ongoing activity in which we choose to either reject or join God. Hebrews 3:7-8 states "So, as the Holy Spirit says: "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion, ...". We must listen intently for God's still small voice and submit to His promptings to keep our hearts soft and beating for Him.

Even King David, "a man after God's own heart", his son, Solomon, Saul and many other devout lovers of God hardened their hearts. If it happened to them, it can happen to us as well. There's a disclaimer for investments that "past performance is not a guarantee of future performance". This is true of our faithfulness also; our past success doesn't mean present success.

We must continually take the "script " The Great Physician has prescribed for us, His Word. Scripture softens our spiritual heart and provides the nourishment it needs to thrive. Communion with God in prayer draws our ever wandering hard heart back to Him where it finds rest to recover. Worship is a healing salve applied to our stony hearts. When we "enter His courts with thanksgiving " and "worship in spirit and truth" it's like a heart transplant. The diseased hard heart is transformed and we're given a "new heart".

The One who created us knows how to perfectly heal us. He has given us everything we need for a soft healthy heart and abundant life. Our cardiologist lets us choose whether to follow his regimen and so does God. Won't you choose to daily follow Him and receive abundant life, my friend? In the Grip of God's Grace.


