Why do kids who grow up together turn out so different? As I write this, I am preparing for my brother's funeral service. We were around each other during the summer quite a bit. I remember visiting him one year; his mom had signed us up to attend a Pennsylvania church camp. It was in the mountains, and we would have camp guides lead us through. Unfortunately, the camp guides split us up, not realizing those few weeks were the only weeks we really got to see each other since we didn't live with each other. Looking back, I understand why; they sought to build bonds with the children and share the gospel. It was an excellent time to hear the gospel for the first time in my life. I look back and realize that is the first time a gospel seed was planted in my heart. My brother also heard the gospel, and for a long while, it was hard to tell if that seed was growing. As I look back at my life, that seed wouldn't sprout up for about ten years, and I wonder if it ever sprouted in my brother. I know God is loving and not desiring any to perish, and ultimately my hope for my brother lies in Christ and His grace and mercy.

As a church, we get to plant seeds. Part of the new vision will help equip us in a way that allows us to plant more seeds than ever. There will be times when we wonder if the seeds we plant are taking root and will bear fruit in the future. We must trust the results to God. Our focus should be on seeking God for this vision and ways to implement it so that we can be part of the lives of many in our community. I cannot help but wonder, how different my brother's life would have been if he had a church family like ours to come alongside him in his darkest hours to shine the light of Christ upon him.

We as Christians are the ministers of the Gospel, as were the Apostles. We were given this assignment on the first day we accepted Jesus as our Savior.
