More Than a Trip: Encountering God through People

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.

So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth."

1 Corinthians 3:6-7

I recall one summer as a teenager, I would visit my

dad during the summer months. He lived in Indianapolis, while I lived near Chicago. I had to take a bus into Chicago and then board another one to Indianapolis. The world has certainly changed since then—I don't think anyone in their right mind would trust doing that today.

One thing, however, hasn't changed: the need for our teens and kids to encounter God in a meaningful way.

That summer, right after I arrived, my brother was scheduled to go on a youth trip. Up to that point, I had never really been to church. The trip was two weeks long, and they had already signed me up. I was very excited to go, since it was the only time of the year I got to see my brother. But as soon as the camp leaders found out we were brothers, they separated us. They didn't seem to understand this was the only time I got to spend with him.

While I was frustrated at first, it quickly turned into a grand adventure. We hiked along Native American trails in the Appalachian Mountains. Throughout this time, the leaders spoke to us about spiritual things, allowing us to ask questions and also asking us questions in return. I remember distinctly that it was the first moment I ever heard the gospel presented to me.

One of the volunteers shared his testimony with me. It wasn't easy to hear: he had survived the slaughter of his entire village by Muslim militants in Africa. He only survived by hiding under the bodies of those who had been martyred. He spoke about how he had lost everything, yet in God's mercy was able to attend college in Europe and eventually make his way to the United States. He marveled at our religious freedom. He asked me if I was ready to repent of my sins and follow Jesus.

The 5 M's of Church

There are many ways to describe the work of local churches. Working with the youth mission to Roanoke last month gave me a new look at how churches come together to meet people's needs. Impact Mission Camps (organized by the BGAV- Baptist General Association of Virginia) helps people stay in their homes. Many churches across Virginia came together to host the mission camp, to feed the campers, and to carry out various home rehabilitation projects. Much of this work organized by the BGAV goes unnoticed but it is critical to prevent people from becoming homeless.

As I watched our GPBC youth and youth leaders, I could not help but see the transfer of generational knowledge and love of the Lord. I saw five elements, **the 5 M's of church**, alive and well. **The 5 M's of church** work together to raise up the next generation of Christians, and Christian leaders and workers.

The "5 M's" in church ministry commonly refer to Members, Maturity, Ministry, Mission and Multiplying the Kingdom. Each area is found in the GPBC Vision -

Rooted in Christ, We Equip Disciples and Leaders for Tomorrow's Challenges with Grace and Truth.

At the time, I didn't fully comprehend all that he was saying. But all these years later, I look back on that as an early, formative event in my life. For me, the mission trip for youth is about far more than fundraisers (thank you so much for supporting them). It's about putting kids on a path to have similar conversations and similar encounters with the living God.

As a teen, that volunteer's story was striking and so foreign to my world, but I understood that there was a real cost to following Jesus. I look back and realize that although that was a single event in my life, it was part of a whole series of moments where God was calling me not only to believe in Him, but to live for Him.

Pray that everyone who went on the trip, including our youth and adult volunteers, realizes the impact they are having. A seed was planted, perhaps watered, and one day soon we will see its harvest. As Paul reminds us: "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:6). This is why missions are one of the four big goals of our vision:

"Rooted in Christ, we equip Disciples and Leaders for tomorrow's challenges with Grace and Truth."

Our Vision supports the growth of God's Kingdom here on earth.
