

Side by Side Respite Ministry serves friends and their families experiencing memory loss. The program currently engages 12-14 participants and will expand to three days per week in October 2025.

Side by Side enjoys the support of John Knox through a grant from the ministry budget, the use of our facilities, and the generous service of a host of volunteers.

John Knox Kindergarten & Parents' Day Out serves over 130 children and their families. Through Christian teachings of love and respect for others, children are guided to grow in their relationships to others and especially to God.

John Knox Church provides the use of our facilities. JKK/PDO provides a generous contribution toward the facility cost for the program.



John Knox Music for Missions Our concert series **John Knox Music for Missions** has sponsored three events in the last year: organ recitals by Josh Harrington and Matthew Hall and a program of vocal music featuring Chelsea Rudisill and Luke Browder. These programs provided valuable exposure and extra financial support for Side by Side Respite Ministry, Greer Relief, and United Ministries.

Worship \$324,331 32% Our chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. Our worship invites us to grow as people who behold God's glory and ascribe God praise.

Discipleship \$303,107 30% Jesus instructs us to make disciples. As His followers, we seek to grow in the faith and to equip people of all ages to do the same.

Outreach \$156,187 15% Our service to Christ demands our service to the world. We are given the Good News to share in word and deed, to neighbors near and far.

Care \$224,432 22% (Evangelism, Nurture, Fellowship)

Why pledge?

- 1. Pledges of financial support allow the church to plan more accurately. Our church gratefully receives all gifts, pledged and unpledged. But our budgeting for the next year is most accurate when we can depend upon the good-faith estimates of those who intend to give. Your pledges help us plan responsibly and staff appropriately.
- 2. Pledging helps givers to honor their priorities for financial commitment. Some people are reluctant to pledge, fearing that they will be unable to keep their commitment. Those who do pledge usually find that this commitment reminds them of their intention. Expressing our commitment ahead of time reduces the chance that unforeseen events will derail our intended support.
- 3. Our faithful commitment to Christ's ministry deepens our sense of God's unfailing commitment to us.

Committing ourselves in faith shows that "we get it." Having experienced God's faithfulness, we trust God's faithful care in our future. Responding in faith demonstrates and deepens our trust in God.
