AS WE GATHER: In the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) no one takes up the office of pastor simply of his own volition. A man must be formed and trained as a pastor, examined by the church as to both his character and his ability to teach the Word of God faithfully, called by God through the church and, because our congregations are not independent franchises but members of a confessional fellowship, we also seek to recognize in a public way through the participation of the wider church that a pastor is properly called. Ordination is the public rite of the church, living in Christ, that proclaims openly all these elements. We welcome you today to this Rite of Ordination and Installation of Jonathan Chapa.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

- C I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE RITE OF ORDINATION

P Beloved in the Lord, Jonathan Chapa has been called by Jesus Christ, the Lord of the Church into the Office of the Holy Ministry of the Word and Sacraments. He has been prepared for this ministry by careful study and prayer. He has been examined and declared ready and prepared to undertake this sacred responsibility, and, by the guidance of God the Holy Spirit, he has, in the Church's usual order, been called to serve as Associate Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Merrill, Wisconsin. We are all gathered here on behalf of the whole Church around the world to give our blessing in presenting him, according to the apostolic practice, to be ordained and consecrated to this office established by God.

- P O Lord God, heavenly Father, by the blessed light of Your holy Word You have led us to the knowledge of Your Son. We humbly implore You to replenish us with the grace of Your Holy Spirit that we may ever walk in the light of Your truth and, rejoicing with sure confidence in Christ, our Savior, be brought to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

SCRIPTURAL INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

R Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the institution of the Office of the Holy Ministry:

- ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)
- ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." (John 21:15-17)

SCRIPTURAL INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

- R Hear what the Holy Scripture says concerning the strength and promise God gives to those in the Office of the Holy Ministry:
- ¹⁵When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." ¹⁷He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. (John 21:15-17)
- A ⁴⁶ and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, ⁴⁷ and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. (Luke 24:46-47)
- ⁴ Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God. ⁵ Not that we are sufficient in ourselves to claim anything as coming from us, but our sufficiency is from God, (2 Corinthians 3:4-5)
- A The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. ²Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. ⁴ He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, ⁵ for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? ⁶ He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. ⁷ Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil. (1 Timothy 3:1-7)
- ² shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; ³ not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. ⁴ And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. (1 Peter 5:2-4)

SCRIPTURAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE STRENGTH AND PROMISE IN THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

- R Hear what the Holy Scripture says concerning the strength and promise God gives to those in the Office of the Holy Ministry:
- A ¹⁷ "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." ¹⁸ For it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends. (2 Corinthians 10:17-18)
- A ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:14-17)

THE ORDINATION

R God gathers His church by and around His Holy Gospel and thereby also grants it growth and increase according to His good pleasure. That this may be done, He has established the Office of the Holy Ministry into which you have been called by the Church and are now to be ordained and consecrated by prayer and the laying on of hands.

In the presence of this congregation, Trinity Lutheran Church in Merrill, Wisconsin, and before our Lord God to whom you must give an account now and at the Last Day, I now ask you:

Do you acknowledge that the Lord has called you through His church into the ministry of Word and Sacraments?

Jonathan: I do.

- R Do you believe and confess the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?
- Jonathan: Yes, I believe and confess the canonical Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- R Do you believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds, namely the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds, as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?
- Jonathan: Yes, I believe and confess the three Creeds, because they are in accord with the Word of God. I also reject all the errors they condemn.
- R Do you confess the Unaltered Augsburg Confession to be a true exposition of Holy Scripture and a correct exhibition of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church? And do you confess that the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, and the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, The Treatise on the Authority of the Primacy of the Pope, and the Formula of Concord as they are contained in the Book of Concord of 1580, are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith?

Jonathan: Yes I make these confessions my own because they are in accord with the Word of God.

R Do you promise that you will perform the duties of your office in accordance with these Confessions, and that all your preaching and teaching and your administration of the Sacraments will be in conformity with Holy Scripture and with these Confessions?

Jonathan: Yes, I promise with the help of God.

R Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel, and will you compassionately admonish the people to a lively confidence in Christ and holy living?

Jonathan: Yes, I will with the help of God

R Finally, will you adorn the office of the holy ministry with a holy life? Will you be diligent in study of Holy Scripture and the Confessions? And will you be constant in prayer for those under your pastoral care?

Jonathan: I will, the Lord helping me through the power and grace of His Holy Spirit.

(Laying hands on the candidate)

R Jesus said: "Peace be to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Jonathan Thomas Chapa, I ordain and consecrate you to the Office of the Holy Ministry of the Word and Sacraments in the one, holy, Christian, and apostolic Church, in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- C Amen.
- R The Lord Jesus pour out on you His Holy Spirit for this office and work that you may faithfully preach the Gospel and administer the Sacraments.
- C Amen.
- P Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray.
- C Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
- **THE VESTING** (The other clergy lay on hands and offer a blessing from the Word of God. Upon completion of this, the newly ordained stands and is vested with a red stole as an insignia of the office which is placed upon the shoulders of the newly ordained.)

RESPONSIBILITYY AND BLESSING OF THE CHURCH

- P Will the congregation please rise. Beloved in the Lord, Holy Scripture says, "Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you." Will you, the faithful, according to the Church's public confession, and speaking for the whole Church, receive Pastor Chapa as a servant of Christ and minister of Word and Sacrament? If so, then answer: We will.
- C We will. But more than that, we give thanks to God for raising up this servant for Christ's people, and we commend him to the whole church, to support and to heed as one authorized in Jesus' name, to publicly proclaim God's Word, and to administer Christ's sacraments. May the Word of Law from his mouth, convict all souls toward repentance, and may the Word of Good News from his mouth, assure all souls of

reconciliation with the Father, through the blood of Christ. May he know the Spirit's strength and power.

P We pray: O eternal, merciful God, You have spoken through Your own dear Son, saying that the harvest is plentiful but the laborers few and that we should ask You, the Lord of the harvest, to send laborers into Your harvest. Hear now our prayer on behalf of Jonathan who this day has been ordained and consecrated to be Your minister in your Church. Strengthen him mightily to take up the Word of truth and faithfully to administer Your holy Sacraments.

O Lord Jesus Christ, our great High Priest, You gave Your own life to be a holy and perfect sacrifice for us and for our salvation. Grant Jonathan a heart zealous for Your people and boldness to guide, comfort, admonish, and serve Your congregation with gentleness and wisdom. Fill him, Your undershepherd, with Your love, that in Your name he will seek the straying and bear up the weak. Give him the heart never to grow weary in the service of Your flock.

O Holy Spirit, strengthen and keep Jonathan in the Word of truth and life, and support him in every time of trouble and distress. Make his labors fruitful and, when the day of labor is ended, grant him to come rejoicing before Your presence to receive with all the saints his portion in eternal salvation.

And to You, God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all glory and honor both now and forever. **Amen.**

- R The almighty and most merciful God strengthen and assist you always. Jonathan are you willing and ready to assume this trust and responsibility?
